### **Decisions Required:**

(1) To consider an application for a new Premises Licence under the Licensing Act 2003

#### Report:

### **Application**

An application has been made by Daniel Potter of The Gallery, Unit Z The Maltings Station Road Sawbridgeworth CM21 9JX, for a new premises licence at Unit K The Maltings Station Road Sawbridgeworth Essex CM21 9JX.

The application is for the following licensing activities,

1. The Provision of Live Music Friday to Saturday 18.00 – 23.00, Sunday 12.00 – 22.00

The Provision of Recorded Music Monday to Tuesday 10.00-17.00, Wednesday and Sunday 10.00-22.00, Thursday to Saturday 10.00-23.00

The Sale by Retail of Alcohol Monday to Tuesday 12.00 - 17.00 Wednesday and Sunday 12.00 - 22.00 Thursday to Saturday 12.00 - 23.00, On and Off sales

**Non Standard timings** 

Summer Bank Holidays in August where there is a possibility that live music will take place.

This is also to include Easter Monday and May bank holiday. The same timings would be in place for a Sunday session.

Live Music Christmas Eve and New Year's Eve until 00.30am Recorded Music may be extended on Christmas Eve and New Year's Eve with the use of a DJ

Sale by Retail of Alcohol may be extended on Christmas Eve and New Year's Eve to 00.30am

Opening Times may be extended on Christmas Eve and New Year's Eve to 01.00am

Opening Times requested, Monday to Tuesday 10.00 – 17.00 Wednesday and Sunday 10.00 – 22.00 Thursday to Saturday 10.00 – 23.00

2 The application was received and valid on the 22<sup>nd</sup> June 2022

The Operating Schedule sets out conditions which will be attached to the licence if this application is granted.

- When considering an application for a licence the licensing authority must have regard to steps that are appropriate to promote of the licensing objectives.

  These are—
  - (a) the prevention of crime and disorder;
  - (b) public safety;
  - (c) the prevention of public nuisance; and
  - (d) the protection of children from harm.
- 4 It must also have regard to its Statement of Licensing Policy and any guidance issued by the Secretary of State.

### Consultation

- 5 The Responsible Authorities have all received a copy of the application, it was also advertised at the premises and in a local newspaper. A copy of the Blue Notice and Newspaper advert are attached to this report.
- **6** All residences and businesses within 150 meters radius of the premises were individually consulted.
- 7 The authority has received 7 representations of objection 2 from local residents, and 5 from nearby businesses, please see emails attached.
- **8** A response from Essex Police with recommendations has been agreed by the applicant, these conditions are attached to this report
- **9** Essex Fire and Rescue responded advising they do not propose to carry out an inspection at this present time, copy of letter attached.
- **10** The Objections relates to Public Safety and the Prevention of Public Nuisance, Copies of the objections are attached to this report

### **Guidance Issued by the Secretary of State**

- **11** The Licensing Act 2003 provides that the licensing authority must 'have regard to' guidance issued by the Secretary of State under section 182.
- **15** Sections 2.15 to 2.21 of the Guidance are relevant to this application

## **Options**

In determining this application the Sub-Committee may take any of the following steps as it considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives, namely:

- (a) to grant the licence as applied for subject to
  - the conditions mentioned in the Operating Schedule modified as the Subcommittee considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives, and
  - the mandatory conditions specified in the Licensing Act 2003, or
- (b) to exclude from the scope of the licence any licensable activities to which the application relates, or
- (c) refuse to specify a person as the premises supervisor, or
- (d) reject the application

#### **Determination**

The Sub-committee is asked to determine the application having regard to

- (a) the content of this report and representations
- (b) any additional information obtained from the hearing
- (c) the Council's statement of licensing policy
- (d) Guidance issued by the Secretary of State, and
- (e) the steps appropriate to promote the licensing objectives.

#### **Appeal**

If any party is aggrieved with the decision they can appeal to Magistrates court. The appeal period is 21 days from notification of the decision.
