In terms of specific regulated entertainments please note that:

- Plays: no licence is required for performances between 08:00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience
 does not exceed 500.
- Films: no licence is required for 'not-for-profit' film exhibition held in community premises between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day provided that the audience does not exceed 500 and the organiser (a) gets consent to the screening from a person who is responsible for the premises; and (b) ensures that each such screening abides by age classification ratings.
- Indoor sporting events: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000.
- Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman
 wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not
 exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or
 wrestling with one or more martial arts are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an
 indoor sporting event.
- Live music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.

- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
 - 0 any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority:
 - any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the 0 entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
 - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or 0 on behalf of the school proprietor; and
 - any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.

Variation of Premises Licence, 'Bonhomie', 14 Forest Drive, Theydon Bois CM16 7EY

The Parish Council has considered the application for a Variation of Premises Licence at Bonhomie (formerly Belgique), 14 Forest Drive, Theydon Bois CM16 7EY, and has the following concerns and objections.

Situated in the centre of a small parade of shops in Forest Drive, Theydon Bois, 'Bonhomie' is a café selling drinks, pastries and cakes, and brunch/deli-style hot and cold food. The business has the informal atmosphere of a café and is popular with families. The Parish Council has learned, anecdotally, that the intention is for this establishment to operate as a wine bar in the evenings.

The current Premises Licence for Bonhomie has opening times at 08:00 until 18:30 hours Monday to Sunday. The Variation of Premises Licence application seeks to extend opening times from 08:00 until 22:00 hours Monday to Sunday, and also to extend by the same hours the Sale by Retail of Alcohol, the Provision of Late Night Refreshment, and the Provision of Recorded Music — all to 22:00 hours.

The two storey flats above Bonhomie are in residential occupancy and the locality enjoys a quiet ambience both during the daytime and in the evening. Our main concerns and objections relate to the prevention of public nuisance and protecting the amenity of

residents, possible crime and disorder, excessive drinking, and the protection of children from harm. If this Variation of Premises Licence application was to be granted, Bonhomie would be the only establishment on that side of the road to remain open after 6pm. We have, incidentally, noted that the current opening hours of this business appear to be Monday to Saturday 07:30 – 16:30, Sunday – Closed.

The café is currently licensed to serve alcohol from 08:00 to 18:00 hours. There are two dine-in restaurants on the opposite side of Forest Drive: one of these is licensed to open and serve alcohol from 11:00 to 22.30 (II Bacio restaurant at 19B Forest Drive — to 23.00 Friday and Saturday); the other restaurant is licensed to open and serve alcohol from 12:00 to 23:00 (formerly Kuzine / Mazaca restaurant at 13 Forest Drive, premises are currently closed).

In the interests of the four licensing objectives, including the prevention of public nuisance, the Parish Council objected to Bonhomie's Variation of Premises Licence Application in 2018 to serve alcohol from 08:00 hours. The rationale for that application to serve alcohol so early in the day was, it is understood, to enable Bonhomie to offer a special birthday breakfast (with alcohol). Because the café is currently licenced to operate only during the daytime, the ability to serve alcohol from 08:00 has thankfully not noticeably changed the relaxed café vibe. Coffee, hot chocolate and other non-alcoholic drinks still appear to be the main order of the day.

However, to extend the hours of operating into the late evening – to 22:00 – would change this establishment from a café to a bar. The application is seeking to serve drinks and food both inside the premises, and outside the premises on an outdoor seating area. The disturbance to residents of the flats above, and also to residents of the flats located above premises on the opposite side of the road, would be unacceptable. The whole feel of this predominantly quiet neighbourhood would change.

There have been issues in the past whereby customers of the II Bacio restaurant at 19B Forest Drive caused a public nuisance through drinking on the forecourt area immediately outside that restaurant. Following a hearing, EFDC Licensing imposed strict conditions on the II Bacio premises licence whereby no food or drinks can be served outside the restaurant after 16:00 hours, and any doors to the restaurant must remain closed at all times. Smoking immediately outside the restaurant is restricted to 5 people at any time and must be supervised by a member of staff.

The Parish Council is strongly of the view that Bonhomie's Variation of Existing Premises Licence must be refused – for the sake of maintaining public safety, the protection of children, avoiding crime and disorder, and avoiding public nuisance. Noise nuisance in the evening caused by music and customers inside Bonhomie would inevitably reverberate

around several of the residential flats above. Equally, customers eating and drinking outside during the evening, and arriving and leaving by car, would cause a serious disruption to all nearby residents – including those living further along Forest Drive and in Buxton Road.

Other restaurants in Forest Drive do not serve food and drink outside during the evening (the restaurant at 13 Forest Drive does not serve food and drink outside at all). For Bonhomie to do so would be an anomaly and set an extremely unwelcome precedent. It would negatively change the pleasant and predominantly tranquil atmosphere of the village's parade of shops — and the peaceful environment that is returned to its residents in the evening. Lighting of the premises into the evening is also a public safety concern and is in conflict with the Theydon Bois Dark Skies Policy.

The 'Prevention of Public Nuisance' clauses annexed to the current Premises Licence for Bonhomie mandate that: the business must avoid causing disturbance to nearby residents; delivery of goods are carried out at such a time as to prevent nuisance and disturbance to nearby residents; staff who arrive early or depart late when the business is not open for trading must conduct themselves in such a manner to avoid causing disturbance to nearby residents.

If the business was to be open 7 days a week from 08:00 in the morning to 22:00 at night, serving alcohol and playing recorded music, as this application seeks to do, it would be impossible to not cause disturbance to nearby residents, nor to avoid creating a negative impact on the amenity of residents. This quiet location is clearly not suitable for the proposed evening operation, which does not, in the Parish Council's view, have regard to the proximity of residential development. The Parish Council requests that Epping Forest District Council refuses this Variation of Premises Licence application.

One of my officers had a look at the planning history of this site and it appears that planning consent ref: EPF/0190/09, which was the proposal for the continuance of use of premises as mixed use (Class A1 shops and Class A3 café), contained the following condition:

"The use hereby permitted shall not be open to customers/members of the public outside the hours of 8.00am to 6.00pm Monday to Saturday, 8.00am to 3.00pm on Sundays and shall remain closed on public holidays."

There appear to be no applications since that suggest any change to this, so the applicants may need to be informed that planning consent is likely going to be required for the change in their opening hours.

Mandatory Conditions All Premises Licence authorising supply of alcohol

The licence is granted subject to the Mandatory conditions for sale of alcohol as set out in the Licensing Act 2003 as amended by the Licensing Act 2003 (Mandatory Licensing Conditions) Order 2010 and Order 2014.

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the Premises Licence -
 - (a) At a time when there is no Designated Premises Supervisor in respect of the Premises Licence; or
 - (b) At a time when the Designated Premises Supervisor does not hold a Personal Licence or his Personal Licence is suspended.
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the Premises Licence must be made, or authorised by a person who holds a Personal Licence.
- 3. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises.
 - a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

- d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
- e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).
- 4. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 5. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licences must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
 - (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either:-
 - (a) a holographic mark or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- 6. The responsible person shall ensure that -
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
 - (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
 - (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

Minimum Drinks Pricing

- 1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1
 - (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979
 - (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula -

$$P = D + (DxV)$$

Where -

- (i) P is the permitted price
- (ii)D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence
 - (i) The holder of the premises licence
 - (ii) The designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) The personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from the paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 4. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b)
 - of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

If the Premises Licence allows Exhibition of Films

- 1. Where a premises licence authorises the exhibition of films, the licence must include a condition requiring the admission of children to the exhibition of any film to be restricted in accordance with this section.
- 2. Where the film classification body is specified in the licence, unless subsection (3)(b) applies, admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation by that body.

3.Where

- (a) The film classification body is not specified in the licence, or
- (b) The relevant licensing authority has notified the holder of the licence that this subsection applies to the film in question,

admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by that licensing authority.

4.In this section "children" means any person aged under 18; and "film classification body" means the person or persons designated as the authority under Section 4 of the Video Recordings Act 1984(c39) (authority to determine suitability of video works for classification).

If the Premises Licence has conditions in respect of Door Supervision except theatres, cinemas, bingo halls and casinos

- 1. Where a premises licence includes a condition that at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity, each such individual must:
 - (a) be authorised to carry out that activity by a licence granted under the Private Security Industry Act 2001; or
 - (b) be entitled to carry out that activity by virtue of section 4 of the Act.
- 2.But nothing in subsection (1) requires such a condition to be imposed:
 - (a) in respect of premises within paragraph 8(3)(a) of Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001 (c12) (premises with premises licences authorising plays or films); or
 - (b) in respect of premises in relation to:
 - (i) any occasion mentioned in paragraph 8(3)(b) or (c) of that Schedule (premises being used exclusively by club with club premises certificate, under a temporary event notice authorising plays or films or under a gaming licence), or
 - (ii) any occasion within paragraph 8(3)(d) of that Schedule (occasions prescribed by regulations under that Act.
- 3. For the purposes of this section:
 - (a) "security activity" means an activity to which paragraph 2(1)(a) of that Schedule applies, and, which is licensable conduct for the purposes of that Act, (see Section 3(2) of that Act) and
 - (b) paragraph 8(5) of that Schedule (interpretation of references to an occasion) applies as it applies in relation to paragraph 8 of that schedule.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule:

General

To promote the four Licensing Objectives, Management will have strong controls and effective training of all staff to ensure awareness of the premises licence and the requirements to meet the four licensing objectives with particular attention to:

- a) no selling of alcohol to underage people
- b) no drunk and disorderly behaviour on the premises area
- c) vigilance in preventing the use and sale of illegal drugs at the retail area
- d) no violent and anti-social behaviour
- e) no any harm to children
- The Designated Premises Supervisor will have day-to-day control of the premises and will provide good training for staff on the Licensing Act (Training Record), to make or authorise each sale
- A Challenge 25 scheme will be operated to prevent the supply of alcohol to under-age drinkers.
- Alcohol will be stored in a lockable cabinet to ensure that it is safe and secure at all times

The DPS will operate the business with a purpose of promoting the four licensing objectives. This will be supported through the operating schedules and other measures (including staff training and qualifications, policies, and strategic partnerships with other agencies).

The Prevention of Crime and Disorder.

- 1. The premises shall have installed and maintain a closed circuit television surveillance (CCTV) system which at all times complies with the below requirements:
 - i. CCTV will be provided in the form a recordable system, capable of providing pictures of evidential quality in all lighting conditions particularly facial recognition;
 - ii. CCTV cameras shall cover all entrances and exits and the areas where alcohol sales take place;
 - Equipment must be maintained in good working order, be correctly time and date stamped, recordings must be kept in good working order and kept for a minimum period of 31 days;
 - iv. Upon the reasonable request of the police or licensing authority staff, within 48 hours viewable copies of recordings will be provided.
- 2. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made immediately available to police or licensing authority staff upon request. The log must be kept as a bound document with individually numbered pages and be retained for a period of at least 6 months after the last incident recorded. The log must be completed as soon as is possible and within any case within 4 hours of the occurrence and shall record the following:
 - a) all crimes reported to the venue
 - b) all ejections of patrons
 - c) any complaints received concerning crime and disorder
 - d) any incidents of disorder
 - e) all seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
 - f) any faults in a CCTV system, searching equipment or scanning equipment mandated as a condition of the licence

Public Safety

- 1. A clear and legible notice to be displayed outside the premises indicating the normal hours of operation during which licensable activities are permitted.
- 2. Clear and conspicuous notices must be displayed warning of potential criminal activity, such as theft, that may target customers.
- Alcohol must not be sold to intoxicated customers.
- 4. Custom must not be sought by means of personal solicitation outside or in the vicinity of the licensed premises.
- 5. Staff will be trained in asking customers to use the premises in an orderly and respectful manner and prevent drinking alcohol at the retail counter area
- 6. Alcohol will only be served ancillary to a meal.
- 7. A refusal log book must be kept at the premises.
- 8. A Health & Safety Manual must be kept at the premises.

Prevention of Public nuisance

- 1. Prominent, clear and legible notices must be displayed at the exit to the premises requesting customers to respect the needs of nearby residents and to leave the premises and the area quietly.
- Deliveries of goods necessary for the operation of the business must be carried out at such a time or in such a manner as to prevent nuisance and disturbance to nearby residents.
- Management will ensure that staff who arrive early morning or depart late afternoon (eg.
 for unpacking, pricing newly delivered goods) when the business is not open for trading,
 must conduct themselves in such a manner to avoid causing disturbance to nearby
 residents.
- Customers to be requested not to stand around loudly talking in the street outside the premises.
- Customers must not be admitted to the premises outside of opening hours.
- 6. The movement of bins and rubbish outside the premises will be kept to a minimum and there will be no activity after 19:00.

7. Any lighting on or outside the premises must be positioned and screened in such a way so as to not cause a disturbance to nearby residents.

The Protection of children from harm

A Challenge 25 scheme shall be operated, whereby any person who appears to be under the age of 25 years of age is required to produce on request an item which meets the mandatory age verification requirement and is either a:

- Proof of age card bearing the PASS Hologram;
- Photocard driving licence;
- Passport; or
- Ministry of Defence Identity Card.
