# **Licensing Committee - Terms of Reference**

- (1) The full Committee shall comprise 15 Councillors appointed by the Council at it's annual meeting, including a Chairman and Vice-Chairman.
- (2) For the functions set out in Appendix 1, and the legislation listed in Appendix 2, a Subcommittee consisting of no more than any three Councillors drawn from the members of the full Committee shall be formed. Any such Subcommittee shall include, by rota, one of the six Licensing Subcommittee Chairmen appointed at each Annual Council meeting.
- (3) The Quorum for the Committee is set out in the Rules set out in Part 4 of this Constitution save that no business shall be transacted unless either the Chairman or Vice-Chairman of the Committee is present.
- (4) The Committee and Subcommittees shall have full authority to hear and determine licensing applications.
- (5) The Committee and Subcommittees shall be further empowered to determine appeals made against the decisions of the Director of Neighbourhoods taken under delegated authority on licensing applications. (See Council delegation schedule for more details)
- (6) The Committee shall at all times carry out its duties solely within the policy from time to time determined by the Council and shall conduct its proceedings in accordance with the requirements set out in Appendix 3 (Conduct of Business by Licensing Committee and Subcommittees).
- (7) The Licensing Committee shall take no part in the production or revision of the statement of licensing policy made under Section 5 of the Licensing Act 2003, however, they may determine policy under the legislation listed in Appendix 2 to this Article.
- (8) To be responsible for the consideration and approval of Designation Orders under Section 13 of the Criminal Justice and Police Act 2001 (Exercise of Controls over the consumption of alcohol in Public Places).

# PART A – CONDUCT OF BUSINESS BY LICENSING COMMITTEE AND SUBCOMMITTEES

All references to committee in this annex shall be taken to infer a reference to the associated subcommittees.

#### 1. General Conduct

- 1.1 All hearings of the Licensing Committee under the Licensing Act 2003, are to be held in accordance with the Personal Licences, Hearings, Premises Licences and Club Premises Certificates, and Licensing Register Regulations, made under the Licensing Act 2003.
- 1.2 The Council's Constitution shall regulate the conduct of and debate at meetings.
- 1.3 In the case of hearings under the Licensing Act 2003, the Committee shall only consider those matters relevant to the licensing objectives as set out in the Licensing Act 2003 and the statement of licensing policy adopted by the Council.

#### 2. Declarations of Interest

2.1 Members of the Committee are subject to the Council's Code of Conduct.

#### 3. Participation in the Hearing

- 3.1 Debate shall be restricted to members of the Licensing Committee. Where a local ward member, not being a member of the Committee, wishes to participate in the hearing, they may do so only with the permission of the Chairman and their participation shall be subject to the same rules as are applied to any other witnesses to the application.
- 3.2 In hearings other than those under the Licensing Act 2003, where a ward member is a member of the Committee, and wishes to object to the application, the member shall give 14 days' notice of their intention, and shall play no part in the decision-making process of the Committee. In hearings under the Licensing Act 2003, those named as responsible authorities and interested parties in the Act may only make representations within the time limits set out in the relevant statutory provisions.
- 3.3 All persons participating in the hearing shall be made aware of the limitations or scope of statements that will be acceptable and, in particular, that statements should be factual or a fair statement on a matter of public interest.
- 3.4 In the case of any hearing pursuant to the summary review procedure under the Violent Crime Reduction Act 2006, the membership of any Subcommittee adjudicating on such a review shall comprise any three members drawn from the Licensing Committee subject to the proviso that no member should serve more than one hearing.

#### 4. Attendance of the Public

4.1 The Council's Constitution and relevant statutory provisions relating to the admission or exclusion of the public shall apply to all meetings of the Licensing Committee.

# 5. Natural Justice

5.1 There are two elements to natural justice:

# (a) Fairness

- (i) All persons affected by the decision or in the case of matters associated with the Licensing Act 2003, those named as responsible authorities and interested parties in the Act, will be allowed a hearing before a decision is made.
- (ii) Only objectors who can show clearly that they are affected by a decision shall be afforded the right to be heard or, in the case of hearings under the Licensing Act 2003, only those named in the Act as responsible authorities or interested parties.
- (iii) All information shall be made available, where possible in advance, to the applicant and the Committee.
- (iv) All members of the Committee shall be present throughout the hearing of a particular application. Where a member arrives late or leaves during a hearing of a particular application, that member shall play no part in the decision-making process. Where an application is adjourned it shall be continued by the same members only, and no others.
- (v) The Committee shall have discretion in respect of 'late' objections. Such objections shall be clearly marked on the agenda as such and the Committee shall decide on their acceptability. The applicant shall be advised of any late objections. In the case of representations made in relation to the Licensing Act 2003 applications, these shall only be accepted in accordance with the relevant statutory provisions.

# (b) Prevention of Bias

- (i) The rules on the declarations of interest shall be firmly applied.
- (ii) If the Committee moves into private session to consider its decision, it shall be accompanied only by its advising officers, none of whom shall have taken a substantive part in the hearing, and shall play no substantive part in the decision-making process.

# 6. General Procedures for Hearings

- 6.1 The following procedural requirements shall be followed at all times:
  - (a) There shall be no recommendation from officers on the agenda;
  - (b) The Committee shall be supplied with copies of all relevant documentation and the process and order of procedure shall be as follows:

- (i) The Chairman will open the meeting and introduce persons as appropriate asking applicants and representatives to identify themselves.
- (ii) The Chairman will outline the procedure to be followed.
- (iii) The Lead Officer will outline the matter in hand.
- (iv) The applicant or representative will present his/her case, with or without witnesses, and be questioned by members or any objectors/persons making representations present.
- (v) Any objectors/persons making representations may then present their objections/representation, with or without witnesses, and be questioned by members or the applicant/s or their representative.
- (vi) The objectors/persons making representations may make a final statement (without introducing new issues).
- (vii) Finally, the applicant has the right to make a final statement (without introducing new issues).
- (viii) All evidence/disclosures are to be made in the presence of all persons, unless someone voluntarily excuses themselves from the proceedings.
- (ix) Committee members shall restrict themselves to questions and not discussion or comment.
- (x) The applicant, objectors/persons making representations shall be allowed to ask officers questions of a technical/factual nature at any time during the proceedings.
- (xi) An adjournment should be granted where to do otherwise would deny a fair hearing.
- (xii) The Committee may resolve to decide upon the application in private session, however, if it becomes necessary to recall anyone for additional information, everyone shall be invited to return to the Hearing.
- (xiii) The decision shall be given in the presence of all parties that wish to be present and confirmed in writing as soon as possible thereafter. If legal advice is given to members this advice will be repeated in summary form.

# **Decisions Required:**

To determine the application for a new Premises Licence under the Licensing Act 2003

## Report:

### **Application**

- 1. An application has been made by Mr Cemal Albay for a new premises licence for a restaurant at Connaught House, 112/120 High Road, Loughton, IG10 4HJ. The application is for a new premises licence to include the provision of recorded music Monday to Thursday 08:00 to 23:00, Friday to Saturday 08:00 to 23:30 and Sunday 08:00 to 22:30, the sale of alcohol Monday to Thursday 12:00 to 23:00, Friday to Saturday 12:00 to 00:00 and Sunday 12:00 to 22:30 and hours the premises will be open to the public Monday to Thursday 08:00 to 23:00, Friday to Saturday 08:00 to 00:00 and Sunday 08:00 to 22:30. The application was received on the 20<sup>th</sup> September 2018.
- 2. The Operating Schedule sets out conditions which will be attached to the licence if this application is granted.

# **Licensing Act 2003**

3. When considering an application for a licence the licensing authority must have regard to steps that are appropriate to promote of the licensing objectives.

These are—

- (a) the prevention of crime and disorder;
- (b) public safety;
- (c) the prevention of public nuisance; and
- (d) the protection of children from harm.

It must also have regard to its Statement of Licensing Policy and any guidance issued by the Secretary of State.

#### Consultation

4. The Responsible Authorities have received a copy of the application, it was also advertised at the premises and in a local newspaper. The Licensing Department requested the applicant to amend the wording of the initial newspaper advertisement printed on 27<sup>th</sup> September 2018 and the amended advertisement appeared in the 4<sup>th</sup> October 2018 edition.

- **5.** All residences and businesses within 150 meters radius of the premises were individually consulted.
- 6. The authority has received a representation from Loughton Town Council and two representations from local residents, which are also attached. A response has been received from Essex Police, who have agreed with the applicant to add conditions. Environmental Neighbourhoods Team, Child Protection and Trading Standards have no objections.
- 7. The Objections relate to the prevention of public nuisance and crime and disorder.

# Guidance Issued by the Secretary of State

- The Licensing Act 2003 provides that the licensing authority must 'have regard to' guidance issued by the Secretary of State under section 182.
- 9. Sections 2.1 to 2.6 and 2.15 to 2.21 of the Guidance are relevant to this application

# **Options**

In determining this application the Sub-Committee may take any of the following steps as it considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives, namely:

- (a) to grant the licence as applied for subject to
  - the conditions mentioned in the Operating Schedule modified as the Subcommittee considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives, and
  - the mandatory conditions specified in the Licensing Act 2003, or
- (b) to exclude from the scope of the licence any licensable activities to which the application relates, or
- (c) refuse to specify a person as the premises supervisor, or
- (d) reject the application

#### **Determination**

The Sub-committee is asked to determine the application having regard to

- (a) the content of this report and representations
- (b) any additional information obtained from the hearing
- (c) the Council's statement of licensing policy
- (d) Guidance issued by the Secretary of State, and
- (e) the steps appropriate to promote the licensing objectives.

# **Appeal**

If any party is aggrieved with the decision they can appeal to Magistrates court. The appeal period is 21 days from notification of the decision.

  - evidence of the applicant's own identity such as a passport,
  - evidence of their relationship with the European Economic Area family member e.g. a marriage certificate, civil partnership certificate or birth certificate, and
  - evidence that the European Economic Area national has a right of permanent residence in the UK or is one of the following if they have been in the UK for more than 3 months:

- Live music: no licence permission is required for:
  - o a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
  - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
  - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
  - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
  - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
  - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
  - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
  - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.

- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
  - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
  - o any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
  - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
  - o any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.

In respect of your application for a premises licence I have assessed this and would ask you to consider the following conditions for adding to the licence which you have made some reference to in the application.

**Prevention of Crime & Disorder** 

- The premises shall have installed and maintain a closed circuit television surveillance (CCTV) system which at all times complies with the below requirements:
  - i. CCTV will be provided in the form a recordable system, capable of providing pictures of evidential quality in all lighting conditions particularly facial recognition;
  - ii. CCTV cameras shall cover all entrances and exits and the areas where alcohol sales take place;
  - iii. Equipment must be maintained in good working order, be correctly time and date stamped, recordings must be kept in good working order and kept for a minimum period of 31 days;
  - iv. Upon the reasonable request of the police or licensing authority staff, within 48 hours viewable copies of recordings will be provided.
- Signs must be displayed at all entrances (and exits) advising customers that CCTV
  is operating at the premises and shall be a minimum size of 200 x 148 mm and

Strong management controls and effective training of all staff so that they are aware of the premises license and the requirements to meet the four licensing objectives with particular attention to:

a/ no selling of alcohol to underage people

d/ no violent and anti-social behavior

e/ no harm to children

- Operating schedule providing the hours of operation and licensable activities during those hours.
- Designated premises supervisor confirmed it is obligated to be in day-to-day control of the premises, to provide good training for staff on the Licensing Act (Training Record), to make or authorise each sale
- To work with to promote sensible drinking for all patrons.
- CCTV system installed with recording option available.

As a licensed premises, we know that it is necessary to carry out our functions or operate their businesses with a purpose of promoting these objectives.

All staff engaged in the retail sale of alcohol shall be trained in respect of their legal and social responsibility. The training given shall include the content of the premises license and any conditions contained therein.

A record of training shall be kept at the premises available for inspection by authorised persons upon request

### b) The prevention of crime and disorder

CCTV system installed to monitor entrances, exits as well as other parts of the premises in order to address the prevention of crime objective.

The CCTV system shall be capable of taking a head an shoulders shot of persons entering the premises and of recording images to an evidential standard in any light conditions and capable of storing images for 31 days.

A staff member from the premises who can operate the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when premises are open to the public. This staff member shall be able to show Police recent data or footage with the absolute minimum of delay when requested

A premises daily register shall be kept at the premises and this register shall be maintained and kept for a minimum of 12 months. The register shall record the name of the person for the premises on each given day. The register shall record calls made to the premises where there is a complaint made by a resident or neighbour of noise, nuisance or anti-social behavior by persons attending or leaving the premises

This shall record the details of the caller, the time and date of incident about which the call is being made and any actions taken to deal with the call

The Premises daily register shall be readily available for inspection by an authorised person throughout the trading hours of the premises. The premises daily register shall also record all incidents in relation to the use of any force by staff or door supervisors in the removal of persons from the premises and shall record the time and date of occurrence, name or brief description of the person removed and details of the staff members involved.

Alcohol shall only be served to customers who are seated at a table taking food, alcohol shall only be served by waiter or waitress service. Customers may be served alcohol before during or after their meal.

A clear and legible notice outside the premises indicating the normal hours under the terms of the premises license during which licensable activities are permitted.

### c) Public safety

Internal and external lighting fixed to promote the public safety objective.

Staff shall be trained in respect of fire risk assessment and health and safety risk assessment

First Aid Facilities shall be maintained at the premises

All parts of the premises and all fittings and apparatus therein, door fastenings and notices, lighting, heating, electrical, air conditioning, sanitary accommodation and other installations, will be maintained at all times in good order and in a safe condition.

### d) The prevention of public nuisance

The premises license holder shall implement a written dispersal policy to move customers from the premises and the immediate vicinity in such a way as to cause minimum disturbance or nuisance to neighbours, both residential and business, creating minimal impact upon the neighbourhood in relation to potential nuisance, anti-social behavior, crime and disorder

The area to the front of the premises shall be kept clean and tidy at all times the premises are open to the public A notice shall be displayed at the exit requesting customers to leave quietly and not to loiter outside the premises or in the vicinity, the notice shall be reinforced verbally by staff at the premises.

No more than 8 customers shall be allowed outside the premises at any time, a notice shall be displayed to use the area quietly respecting residents, this shall be reinforced by staff.

No deliveries will be received at the premises between 20.00hrs and 07.00hrs each day

A telephone number shall be displayed outside the premises for residents to call with any concerns about the premises.

### e) The protection of children from harm

The Premises shall operate a challenge 25 age verification policy and staff shall be trained in respect of the policy.

A notice shall be displayed at the premises to advise customers that challenge 25 is in operation at the premises to adopt adequate controls settings that on Internet access facilities that block site not suitable for children

- A certificate of registration or naturalisation as a British citizen, when produced in combination with an
  official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a
  Government agency or a previous employer.
- A current passport endorsed to show that the holder is allowed to stay in the UK and is currently allowed to
  work and is not subject to a condition preventing the holder from doing work relating to the carrying on of a
  licensable activity.

- A current Biometric Immigration Document (Biometric Residence Permit) issued by the Home Office to the holder which indicates that the named person can currently stay in the UK and is allowed to work relation to the carrying on of a licensable activity.
- A current Residence Card issued by the Home Office to a person who is not a national of a European Economic
  Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights or
  residence.
- A current immigration Status Document containing a photograph issued by the Home Office to the holder
  with an endorsement indicating that the named person may stay in the UK, and is allowed to work and is not
  subject to a condition preventing the holder from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity
  when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance
  number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A Certificate of Application, less than 6 months old, issued by the Home Office under regulation 17(3) or 18A
   (2) of the Immigration (European Economic Area) Regulations 2006, to a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights of residence.
- Reasonable evidence that the person has an outstanding application to vary their permission to be in the UK
  with the Home Office such as the Home Office acknowledgement letter or proof of postage evidence, or
  reasonable evidence that the person has an appeal or administrative review pending on an immigration
  decision, such as an appeal or administrative review reference number.
- Reasonable evidence that a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but
  who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights of residence in exercising treaty rights in
  the UK including:-
  - evidence of the applicant's own identity such as a passport,
  - evidence of their relationship with the European Economic Area family member e.g. a marriage certificate, civil partnership certificate or birth certificate, and
  - evidence that the European Economic Area national has a right of permanent residence in the UK or is one of the following if they have been in the UK for more than 3 months:
    - (i) working e.g. employment contract, wage slips, letter from the employer,

- Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman
  wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not
  exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or
  wrestling with one or more martial arts are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an
  indoor sporting event.
- Live music: no licence permission is required for:
  - o a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
  - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
  - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
  - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
  - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
  - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
  - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
  - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.

- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
  - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
  - o any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
  - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
  - o any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.







### **Reflections from the Rectory**

Rev Jane Quinton moves home from North Weald to Marden Ash

Well according to research 'moving house' is amongst the top five most stressful events we encounter in our lives. And so, having just completed our second move in fifteen months as I write this article, I should be reaching for the wine and Grecian 2000! However, it may be that I am just an exception, but I can honestly say that this last move has been particularly blessed the whole way!

Admittedly it is not usual for a curate to have to move twice during their time in the parish – but our move to Kettlebury Way was originally postponed because of the fire at the High Ongar rectory in the autumn of 2016, which meant that Malcolm and his family had to move into what had originally been ear-marked as our house on my leaving college and arriving in Chipping Ongar. And so since June of last year Graham and I have been housed in the St Andrew's vicarage at North Weald. ### **Notification of Consultation. Licensing Act 2003**

Thank you for your letter of 29 September concerning the above and would reply to you in accordance with the listing of representation in respect of the application.

### 1. The prevention of crime and disorder.

I consider that there is a serious risk of crime and disorder should the application be successful. The venue is a sports club where the clients tend to be of the younger generation. It is well known how excessive alcohol with the young can lead to disorder and crime. One only has to drive down Brentwood High Street at night to see the result.

Surely the purpose of the application is to create a permanent venue where anyone can attend to consume alcohol helped along with music. If the purpose is for the benefit of sportspersons then surely a temporary licensing permit, as required, would suffice.

### 2. Public safety

Living opposite to Love Lane I have no desire to witness or experience disorder at any time in particular at night after closing time. Ongar High Street is a busy main road even at that time of night. There is therefore a risk to pedestrians having consumed a quantity of alcohol.

### 3. The prevention of public nuisance.

In order to prevent public nuisance please do not grant the application!

Should the application succeed it will mean that <u>every</u> day of the week will result in people leaving the venue, late at night, either by car or walking many having had too much to drink, it is not possible to ensure a quiet exit every time, therefore a public nuisance will certainly occur.

Please consider those of us who live in Weighbridge Court. This development is opposite the exit to Love Lane. We are elderly, some of the residents are quite frail, please, we do not want to be disturbed late at night by unsociable behaviour.

### 4. The protection of children from harm.

Please refer to points 1 and 2.

In conclusion I consider the application highly inappropriate for a residential area and trust that the sub committee will reject the application.

Dear Licensing Team,

I wish to make a representation with regards to the application for a Club Premises Certificate made by the Ongar Community Sports Trust.

My representation is made in respect of the prevention of public nuisance licensing objective.

Whilst I support the sports club and hope for it to be successful I do have concerns over the hours requested for recorded music and the provision of live music. Onslow Gardens, which backs on to the sports club, is a quiet street mainly consisting of elderly residents or families with young children. Permitting the hours as requested for recorded and live music, until 23:00 Monday to Thursday and 00:00 on Fridays and Saturdays, has the potential to disturb residents.

Therefore if it is minded to grant the application, in order to minimise any potential disturbance and provide reassurance to residents, I request that the following conditions be placed on the licence:

- A noise limiter must be fitted to the musical amplification system set at a level determined by and
  to the satisfaction of an authorised officer of the Environmental Health Service, so as to ensure that
  no noise nuisance is caused to local residents. The limiter shall not be altered without prior
  agreement with the Environmental Health Service. No additional sound generating equipment shall
  be used on the premises without being routed through the sound limiter device.
- 2. Loudspeakers shall not be located in the entrance or outside the premises building.
- 3. All windows and external doors shall be kept closed after 21:00 hours at any time when regulated entertainment takes place, except for the immediate access and egress of persons.
- 4. Notices shall be prominently displayed at all exits requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and leave the area quietly.
- 5. A direct telephone number for the manager at the premises shall be publicly available at all times the premises is open. This telephone number is to be made available to residents in the vicinity.

I want the sports club to remain a valuable part of the community but I do believe adding the above conditions to the licence is appropriate and proportionate in the circumstances in order to provide residents in close proximity to the premises with the necessary protection.

I am writing in response to the letter I have received regarding the Licence application for Ongar Community Sports Trust based at Jubilee Park Pavilion, Love Lane, Ongar dated 27 September 2018.

I wish to make comments solely on the supply of alcohol. We have lived in Love Lane for 34 years this December, and frankly the noise of any live or recorded music does not reach as far as our property. However, during those 34 years we have witnessed and been subject to many acts of drunkenness and petty vandalism. Although I use the word petty, it is still a nuisance and sometimes slightly frightening considering my wife and I are now both pensioners aged 70 and 66 respectively. Over the years we have had to put up with our heavy verge stones being rolled into the road, something that happened to my neighbour at again just this year. There have been occasions of drunken teenagers running around the cemetery opposite our property and making a loud noise well after midnight. I have had to step out of our front door on occasion as young teens fight in the Lane at mid-afternoon, falling on our property and the verge opposite.

If I concentrate in 2018 alone, we have had problems. The 4 properties in the Lane put out our bins on a Tuesday evening, ready for collection on Wednesday morning. One morning I looked out to find not only our bins pulled over and the contents strewn on the floor, but also my 3 neighbours having had the same done to their bins. I am used to picking up lager cans from my rockery and putting them in the bin, which is a minor irritation, but this year an established plant of several years growth was damaged, and I eventually had to dig it out and replace it. I had to call the police this year when I arrived home and found 3 youths hiding on my property in the dark beside the garage, presumably from a friend of theirs. I then had to put up with a barrage of swear words from one youth, before I closed the front door on him. A stone was later thrown at our kitchen window frightening my wife who was working there.

In retrospect I am not in favour of an all-day drinking licence, just yards from my property. The hours quoted are 11.00 until 23.00 or midnight, depending on the day in question, and 7 days a week no less. I have my suspicions of alcohol having been sold regularly to underage drinkers at the Pavilion. Any problems we have experienced over the years have been the result of youngsters having too much to drink. I have never witnessed any problems from the cricket, rugby or football teams and spectators having a drink during or after their games.

My wife and I do worry that returning the Pavilion to a Sports Trust, will also return us to the 'bad old days' when people drinking until midnight (and possibly beyond), walk down the Lane in the small hours making lots of noise and waking up the neighbourhood. My idea of a compromise would be to limit the supply of alcohol until no later than 22.30 regardless of the day of the week. We are against the proposal as it stands.

I am in receipt of your letter regarding the change in the License for The Ongar Community Sports Trust at The Jubilee Park Pavilion Love Lane Ongar.

You ask for comment concerning this application and as a very near neighbour I thank you for your notification and comment accordingly.

My garden backs on to the Car Park of the Pavilion and we have been disturbed on many occasions over the years due to noise and this disturbance has been exaggerated by the use of the side emergency door as a general entry and exit door. We have also been disturbed, and that includes our Grandchildren who frequently stay with us and sleep at the back of the house overlooking the car park, by the loud noise by users of the car park playing car radios loudly, swearing, unsocial loud discussions, heavy slamming of doors, music noise, etc. especially, but not only, at the end of any evening when people go home. This occurred frequently when the Pavilion was run as a private club. I must say that over the last few years when the Pavilion was run by Ongar Town Council a lot of this disturbance was reduced although we have seen an upturn over the past short period during the changes from Council Ownership to a Trust and therefore back to a private club. As the premises are reverting to an independent club not being run by the Local Council we are concerned that the 'old' problems will resurface.

Due to the above I do have a few proposals to mitigate our disturbance but not to restrict the running of the club.

The Music application seems excessive and could this be restricted to music in the evenings only and to stop at 10.30 on a Friday and 11.30 on Saturday.

Can the Sale of Alcohol Opening Hours, for closing, be reduced and to finish at 10.30 on Monday to Thursday, and 11.00 on Friday and Saturday?

Can the Club be responsible for active monitoring of the Car Park, with a named person in charge during the Sale of Alcohol Opening Hours of the approved licence, and the named person to actively monitor the car park and to ask users to restrict noise outside of the club boundaries.

Can the licence be granted on the basis that during all opening hours all the Emergency Exits, especially the one which opens onto the Car Park, are only used in Emergency and that the main entrance to the front be used at all times.

I trust the above are useful comments for you and I reinforce my view that the Club is a very useful asset for the community, but can the operation be such that disturbance for local residents be restricted as much as possible.
