Decisions Required:

To determine the application for a new Premises Licence under the Licensing Act 2003

Report:

Application

- (1) An application has been made by Antonio Motisi for a new premises Licence at 240 High Road, Loughton, IG10 1HA, the application is for the supply of alcohol Monday to Sunday 12:00-23:00, provision of recorded music 12:00-23:00 and hours premises will be open to the public 12:00-23:00.
- (2) The application was received on the 3 July 2018.
- (3) The Operating Schedule sets out conditions which will be attached to the Licence if this application is granted.

Licensing Act 2003

1 When considering an application for a licence the licensing authority must have regard to steps that are appropriate to promote of the licensing objectives.

These are:

- (a) the prevention of crime and disorder:
- (b) public safety;
- (c) the prevention of public nuisance; and
- (d) the protection of children from harm.
- 2 It must also have regard to its Statement of Licensing Policy and any guidance issued by the Secretary of State.

Consultation

- **3** The Responsible Authorities have received a copy of the application; it was also advertised at the premises and in a local newspaper.
- **4** All residences and businesses within 150 meters radius of the premises were individually consulted.
- 5 The authority has received representations from Loughton Town Council and three local residents, which are also attached. Responses have been received from The Police, who have agreed with the applicant to add conditions. Essex Fire Service and Environmental Neighborhoods Team have no objections.

6 The Objections relate to the prevention of crime and disorder, the prevention of public safety, the prevention of public nuisance and the protection of children from harm.

Guidance Issued by the Secretary of State

- 7 The Licensing Act 2003 provides that the licensing authority must 'have regard to' guidance issued by the Secretary of State under section 182.
- 8 Sections 2.1 to 2.32 of the Guidance are relevant to this application

Options

In determining this application the Sub-Committee may take any of the following steps as it considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives, namely:

- (a) to grant the licence as applied for subject to
 - the conditions mentioned in the Operating Schedule modified as the Subcommittee considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives; and
 - the mandatory conditions specified in the Licensing Act 2003; or
- (b) to exclude from the scope of the licence any licensable activities to which the application relates; or
- (c) refuse to specify a person as the premises supervisor; or
- (d) reject the application.

Determination

The Sub-committee is asked to determine the application having regard to:

- (a) the content of this report and representations;
- (b) any additional information obtained from the hearing:
- (c) the Council's statement of licensing policy;
- (d) Guidance issued by the Secretary of State; and
- (e) the steps appropriate to promote the licensing objectives.

Appeal

If any party is aggrieved with the decision they can appeal to Magistrates court. The appeal period is 21 days from notification of the decision.
