Entitlement to work/immigration status for individual applicants and applications from partnerships which are not limited liability partnerships:

A licence may not be held by an individual or an individual in a partnership who is resident in the UK who:

- does not have the right to live and work in the UK; or
- is subject to a condition preventing him or her from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.

Any premises licence issued irrespective of an application made on or after 6 April 2017 will become invalid if the holder ceases to be entitled to work in the UK.

Applicants must demonstrate that they have an entitlement to work in the UK and are not subject to a condition preventing them from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity. They do this by providing with this application copies or scanned copies of the following documents (which do not need to be certified).

Documents which demonstrate entitlement to work in the UK

- An expired or current passport showing the holder, or a person named in the passport as the child of the holder, is a British citizen or a citizen of the UK and Colonies having the right of abode in the UK [please see note below about which sections of the passport to copy].
- An expired or current passport or national identity card showing the holder, or a person named in the passport as the child of the holder, is a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A Registration Certificate or document certifying permanent residence issued by the Home Office to a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A Permanent Residence Card issued by the Home Office to the family member of a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A **current** Biometric Immigration Document (Biometric Residence Permit) issued by the Home Office to the holder indicating that the person named is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK, or has no time limit on their stay in the UK.
- A **current** passport endorsed to show that the holder is exempt from immigration control, is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK, has the right of abode in the UK, or has no time limit on their stay in the UK.
- A **current** Immigration Status Document issued by the Home Office to the holder with an endorsement indicating that the named person is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK or has no time limit on their stay in the UK, **when produced in combination with** an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A **full** birth or adoption certificate issued in the UK which includes the name(s) of at least one of the holder's parents or adoptive parents, **when produced in combination with** an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A birth or adoption certificate issued in the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man or Ireland **when produced in combination with** an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A certificate of registration or naturalisation as a British citizen, **when produced in combination with** an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A **current** passport endorsed to show that the holder is allowed to stay in the UK and is currently allowed to work and is not subject to a condition preventing the holder from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.

- A **current** Biometric Immigration Document (Biometric Residence Permit) issued by the Home Office to the holder which indicates that the named person can currently stay in the UK and is allowed to work relation to the carrying on of a licensable activity.
- A **current** Residence Card issued by the Home Office to a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights or residence.
- A **current** Immigration Status Document containing a photograph issued by the Home Office to the holder with an endorsement indicating that the named person may stay in the UK, and is allowed to work and is not subject to a condition preventing the holder from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity **when produced in combination with** an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A Certificate of Application, **less than 6 months old**, issued by the Home Office under regulation 17(3) or 18A (2) of the Immigration (European Economic Area) Regulations 2006, to a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights of residence.
- Reasonable evidence that the person has an outstanding application to vary their permission to be in the UK with the Home Office such as the Home Office acknowledgement letter or proof of postage evidence, or reasonable evidence that the person has an appeal or administrative review pending on an immigration decision, such as an appeal or administrative review reference number.
- Reasonable evidence that a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights of residence in exercising treaty rights in the UK including:-
 - evidence of the applicant's own identity – such as a passport,
 - evidence of their relationship with the European Economic Area family member – e.g. a marriage certificate, civil partnership certificate or birth certificate, and
 - evidence that the European Economic Area national has a right of permanent residence in the UK or is one of the following if they have been in the UK for more than 3 months:
 - (i) working e.g. employment contract, wage slips, letter from the employer,
 - (ii) self-employed e.g. contracts, invoices, or audited accounts with a bank,
 - (iii) studying e.g. letter from the school, college or university and evidence of sufficient funds; or
 - (iv) self-sufficient e.g. bank statements.

Family members of European Economic Area nationals who are studying or financially independent must also provide evidence that the European Economic Area national and any family members hold comprehensive sickness insurance in the UK. This can include a private medical insurance policy, an EHIC card or an S1, S2 or S3 form.

Original documents must not be sent to licensing authorities. If the document copied is a passport, a copy of the following pages should be provided:-

- (i) any page containing the holder's personal details including nationality;
- (ii) any page containing the holder's photograph;
- (iii) any page containing the holder's signature;
- (iv) any page containing the date of expiry; and
- (v) any page containing information indicating the holder has permission to enter or remain in the UK and is permitted to work.

If the document is not a passport, a copy of the whole document should be provided.

Your right to work will be checked as part of your licensing application and this could involve us checking your immigration status with the Home Office. We may otherwise share information with the Home Office. Your licence application will not be determined until you have complied with this guidance.

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NOTES ON REGULATED ENTERTAINMENT

Continued from previous page...

In terms of specific **regulated entertainments** please note that:

- **Plays:** no licence is required for performances between 08:00 and 23:00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
- **Films:** no licence is required for 'not-for-profit' film exhibition held in community premises between 08:00 and 23:00 on any day provided that the audience does not exceed 500 and the organiser (a) gets consent to the screening from a person who is responsible for the premises; and (b) ensures that each such screening abides by age classification ratings.
- **Indoor sporting events:** no licence is required for performances between 08:00 and 23:00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000.
- **Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment:** no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08:00 and 23:00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports – defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling with one or more martial arts – are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an indoor sporting event.
- **Live music:** no licence permission is required for:
 - o a performance of unamplified live music between 08:00 and 23:00 on any day, on any premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08:00 and 23:00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08:00 and 23:00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08:00 and 23:00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08:00 and 23:00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- **Recorded Music:** no licence permission is required for:
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08:00 and 23:00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08:00 and 23:00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08:00 and 23:00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.

Continued from previous page...

- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
 - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
 - o any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.

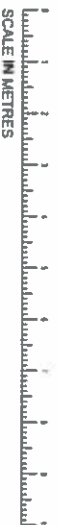

Prevention of Crime & Disorder

1. The premises shall have installed and maintain a closed circuit television surveillance (CCTV) system which at all times complies with the below requirements:
 - i. CCTV will be provided in the form a recordable system, capable of providing pictures of evidential quality in all lighting conditions particularly facial recognition;
 - ii. CCTV cameras shall cover all public areas including all entrances and exits and all areas where the sale of alcohol takes place;
 - iii. Equipment must be maintained in good working order, be correctly time and date stamped, recordings must be kept in good working order and kept for a minimum period of 31 days;
 - iv. At all times, whilst the premises is open for licensable activities, there are members of staff able to immediately provide viewable copies of recordings to the police or licensing authority staff upon reasonable request;
 - v. The recording equipment and data storage devices shall be kept in a secure environment and fitted with security functions (such as passwords) to prevent recordings being tampered with;
 - vi. An operational daily log report must be maintained endorsed by signature, indicating the system has been checked and is compliant: in the event of any failings these are to be recorded immediately.
2. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made immediately available to police or licensing authority staff upon request. The log must be kept as a bound document with individually numbered pages and be retained for a period of at least 6 months after the last incident recorded. The log must be completed as soon as is possible and within any case within 4 hours of the occurrence and shall record the following:
 - (a) all crimes reported to the venue
 - (b) all ejections of patrons
 - (c) any complaints received concerning crime and disorder
 - (d) any incidents of disorder
 - (e) all seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
 - (f) any faults in a CCTV system, searching equipment or scanning equipment mandated as a condition of the licence
3. The premises shall have in place and operate a zero tolerance policy with regard to the use/possession of controlled drugs and psychoactive substances and advertise the same within the premises on posters and similar means. This policy shall specifically include but not be limited to:
 - i. Searching practices upon entry;
 - ii. Dealing with patrons suspected of using drugs on the premises;
 - iii. Scrutiny of spaces including toilets or outside areas;
 - iv. Clear expectations of staff roles (including the DPS, managers/supervisors and door supervisors);
 - v. Staff training regarding identification of suspicious activity and what action to take;
 - vi. The handling of items suspected to be illegal drugs or psychoactive substances
 - vii. Steps taken to discourage and disrupt drug use on the premises
 - viii. Steps to be taken to inform patrons of the premises drug policy/practices

A copy of this policy document shall be lodged with the police and licensing authority.
4. There shall be no events at the premises that are organised, promoted or advertised by an external promoter (i.e. by an individual/organisation not directly related to the management of the premises).

Prevention of Public Nuisance

5. Clear and legible notices must be prominently displayed at all exits requesting customers to respect local residents and leave the area quietly. These signs shall be a minimum size of 200 x 150 mm.
6. Clear and legible notices must be prominently displayed at any area used for smoking requesting customers to respect local residents and use the area quietly. These signs shall be a minimum size of 200 x 150 mm.
7. The premises must operate as a restaurant for the sale of alcohol for consumption **ON** the premises:
 - i. In which customers must be seated at a table;
 - ii. Which provides substantial table meals that are prepared on the premises and are served and consumed at the table;

12. After 23:00 patrons permitted to temporarily leave and then re-enter the premises, e.g. to smoke, shall not be permitted to take drinks or glass containers with them. Notices to that effect will be displayed at the premises exits.

Protection of Children from Harm

13. A Challenge 25 scheme shall be operated, whereby any person who appears to be under the age of 25 years of age is required to produce on request an item which meets the mandatory age verification requirement and is either a:

I also confirm that the address for Zara Bar & Grill, should read 30 Barrington Green and not 32, as quoted under minute no PL492.1.



Licensing Application (Dated : 3 July 2018)
Re: Wing Shack, 240 High Road, Loughton IG10 1HA

I refer to the Application dated as received on 3 July 2018 made by Antonio Motisi on behalf of Wing Shack in relation to 240 High Road, Loughton IG10 1HA for provision in those premises of recorded music and the supply of alcohol Monday to Sunday – ie every day of the week – from 12.00 to 23.00 being the hours stated during which the premises will be open to the public. Although those premises are on the High Road they are near to The Drive and are therefore close to our house which is [REDACTED] [REDACTED]. Whilst in principle we have no objection to the sale of alcohol and the provision of recorded music played very quietly within the premises the application mentioned is of concern for the following reasons:

Prevention of crime and disorder

There have been various problems in the locality in relation to unreasonable noise and disturbance emanating from people attending/leaving local club premises which have now been closed. Wing Shack appears to be a restaurant with an outdoor area fronting the High Road. The proposed hours of opening and the likelihood of the recorded music being played loudly may result in considerable nuisance to the neighbouring residential areas particularly as the licences sought are for the sale of alcohol and the playing of music during many hours every day of the week. Furthermore, people visiting that restaurant and using the Car Park in The Drive, which car park is opposite my house, are not infrequently loud particularly late evenings at weekends, causing noise and disturbance. With the opening hours, consumption of alcohol and playing of recorded music that has been requested it is likely that such nuisance, which may result in crime and disorder, will not only continue but increase.

Public Safety

Crime may result from the disorder mentioned in the preceding paragraph but that may not only be in the Car Park mentioned but also in the High Road resulting in cause for concern about public safety. There are residences above shops in the High Road as well as the residential areas adjacent to the High Road including those in The Drive.

Prevention of public nuisance

Inevitably there will be nuisance and disturbance to residents if a Licence is granted permitting the opening hours of 12.00 to 23.00 every day as requested in the application by Wing Shack. Whilst the premises concerned are in the High Road the shop is close to many residential flats and houses occupied not merely by adults but also by children. We, at the beginning of The Drive, suffer noise and disturbance from the lorries as well as cars parking to visit the High Road premises, the Yoga/exercise premises accessed at the rear of Robert Dyas of 228 High Road, Loughton as well as the Morrisons supermarket, the vehicular entrance to which is effectively opposite us. Any Licence for the sale of alcohol on the premises that may be granted should be granted for specific hours which are limited to, say, the usual luncheon hours and then later for usual dinner hours and not be permitted for all the hours requested in the Application. Further, the level at which any recorded music is played should be limited to ensure that only a very low level of sound emanates from the premises particularly as it appears that the front of the premises has windows/doors that open the width of the premises giving access to an external seating area. The possibility of requiring sound proofing be installed within the premises and doors/windows to be kept closed seems unlikely! Inevitably in the current warm weather those doors/windows appear to be continually open when the premises are in use so noise inevitably emanates.

Protection of children from harm

Some neighbouring residences are occupied by children. Sleep is important to all but specifically children needing to arise early for school. Any unruly behaviour of people due to alcohol consumption and loud noise emanating from the playing of music in the premises should preferably be avoided, especially in a neighbourhood where there are children. Unless limitations are placed on both hours of opening, consumption of alcohol and playing of music it is possible that many, particularly children, may suffer harm.

Please could I make a representation regarding the Licence for Provision of recorded music up to 11pm at Wing Shack, 240 High Road, Loughton.

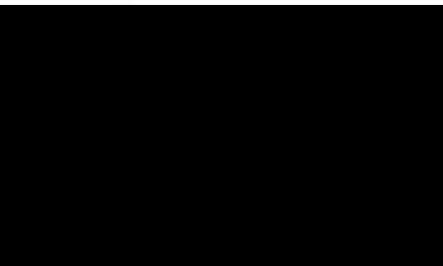

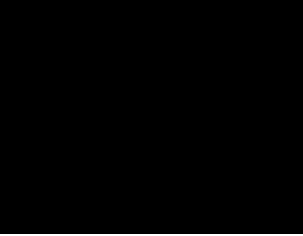
