Forest District Council during the application reference EPF/2163/13. The application has been approved and the
development permitted on 28 March 2014.
-The site is located in Debden, close to the Loughton town, fronts to the Rectory Lane and the Chigwell Lane connected to
the side roads Barrington Green and Vere Road. The site is located in an area of mixed use residential and commercial
developmentThe site falls within the defined town center of Loughton Broadway. The site is located next to busy roads and has retail
and other commercial uses to the south side and west side.
-The general character of the setting to the site is commercial center albeit with residential development at upper levels
nearby. Debden train station within short walking distance located south of the site.
-The shop occupies in total 326sqm shop floor.
-The premises will be operating as Mediterranean style good quality hot and cold food restaurant and takeaway shop,
providing fresh prepared, grilled, fried and cooked white and red meat, salads and hot and cold drinks to its customers. -The premises will have 40 tables with 4 seats each in total 160 seats inside and will have 8 tables with 4 seats in total 32
seats outside.
The premises located at the ground floor of six storey building.
-The kitchen will be located at the back, take away will be at the front. In order to prevent noise arising from the extraction
ventilation system, the system will be installed fully inside the premises. Smoke and odour arising form the kitchen and take
away will be filtered 90% with latest technology powerful extraction ventilation system. 90% filtered kitchen extract will be
discharged via acoustical aluminum weather louvre (exiting from the ground floor, to the rear).
-The bar where the alcohol displayed will be located at the rear right of the premises, alcohol will be stored in the room next
to the barCash register of the restaurant will be located at the bar behind the counter.
-Second cash register will be at the take away side behind the counter.
-The main entrance & fire exit opening towards to the Barrington Green. There is one fire exit at the rear exiting to the rear
car park leading to the Vere road.
-The premises will have 1 disable, 1 ladies WC and one male WC for it's customers.

-Waste collection arrangements done and collecting regularly.

No self service for the alcoholic drinks will be available.

-Prominent, clear and legible notices shall be displayed at all public exits from the premises requesting customers respect the needs of local residents and leave the premises and area quietly. These notices shall be positioned at eye level and a location where those leaving the premises can read them.

- Empty glasses will be removed from the tables after they emptied.

-The restaurant frontage and the rear will be kept clean and tidy at all times.

e) The protection of children from harm

-The premises will operate the Challenge 25 proof of Age Policy and only accept a valid passport, driving license or proof of age card with the PASS logo.

-Challenge 25 notice will be displayed.

-A written record of refused sales shall be kept on the premises and completed when necessary, this record shall be made available to Police and /or Local authority upon request and shall be kept for at least one year from the date of the last entry.

-All staff will receive appropriate training on induction and at refresher training at intervals in operating Challenge 25, asking for proof of age, checking forms of Id, making and recording a refusal of service and completing the refusals book.
-Staff training book will be kept at the premises at all times.

-All training relating to the sale of alcohol and the times and conditions of the premises license shall be documented and records kept at the premises. These records shall be made available to Police and /or Local authority upon request and shall be kept for at least one year.

NOTES ON DEMONSTRATING ENTITLEMENT TO WORK IN THE UK

Entitlement to work/immigration status for individual applicants and applications from partnerships which are not limited liability partnerships:

A licence may not be held by an individual or an individual in a partnership who is resident in the UK who:

- does not have the right to live and work in the UK; or
- is subject to a condition preventing him or her from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.

Any premises licence issued in respect of an application made on or after 6 April 2017 will become invalid if the holder ceases to be entitled to work in the UK.

Applicants must demonstrate that they have an entitlement to work in the UK and are not subject to a condition preventing them from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity. They do this by providing with this application copies or scanned copies of the following documents (which do not need to be certified).

Documents which demonstrate entitlement to work in the UK

- An expired or current passport showing the holder, or a person named in the passport as the child of the
 holder, is A British citizen or a citizen of the UK and Colonies having the right of abode in the UK [please see
 note below about which sections of the passport to copy].
- An expired or current passport or national identity card showing the holder, or a person named in the passport
 as the child of the holder, is a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A Registration Certificate or document certifying permanent residence issued by the Home Office to a national
 of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A Permanent Residence Card issued by the Home Office to the family member of a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A current Biometric Immigration Document (Biometric Residence Permit) issued by the Home Office to the holder indicating that the person named is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK, or has no time limit on their stay in the UK.
- A current passport endorsed to show that the holder is exempt from immigration control, is allowed to stay
 indefinitely in the UK, has the right of abode in the UK, or has no time limit on their stay in the UK.
- A current Immigration Status Document issued by the Home Office to the holder with an endorsement
 indicating that the named person is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK or has no time limit on their stay in
 the UK, when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National
 Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A full birth or adoption certificate issued in the UK which includes the name(s) of at least one of the holder's
 parents or adoptive parents, when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's
 permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A birth or adoption certificate issued in the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man or Ireland when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A certificate of registration or naturalisation as a British citizen, when produced in combination with an
 official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a
 Government agency or a previous employer.
- A current passport endorsed to show that the holder is allowed to stay in the UK and is currently allowed to
 work and is not subject to a condition preventing the holder from doing work relating to the carrying on of a
 licensable activity.

- A current Biometric Immigration Document (Biometric Residence Permit) issued by the Home Office to the
 holder which indicates that the named person can currently stay in the UK and is allowed to work relation to
 the carrying on of a licensable activity.
- A current Residence Card issued by the Home Office to a person who is not a national of a European Economic
 Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights or
 residence.
- A current Immigration Status Document containing a photograph issued by the Home Office to the holder
 with an endorsement indicating that the named person may stay in the UK, and is allowed to work and is not
 subject to a condition preventing the holder from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity
 when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance
 number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A Certificate of Application, less than 6 months old, issued by the Home Office under regulation 17(3) or 18A
 (2) of the Immigration (European Economic Area) Regulations 2006, to a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights of residence.
- Reasonable evidence that the person has an outstanding application to vary their permission to be in the UK
 with the Home Office such as the Home Office acknowledgement letter or proof of postage evidence, or
 reasonable evidence that the person has an appeal or administrative review pending on an immigration
 decision, such as an appeal or administrative review reference number.
- Reasonable evidence that a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but
 who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights of residence in exercising treaty rights in
 the UK including:-
 - evidence of the applicant's own identity such as a passport,
 - evidence of their relationship with the European Economic Area family member e.g. a marriage certificate, civil partnership certificate or birth certificate, and
 - evidence that the European Economic Area national has a right of permanent residence in the UK or is one
 of the following if they have been in the UK for more than 3 months:
 - (i) working e.g. employment contract, wage slips, letter from the employer,
 - (ii) self-employed e.g. contracts, invoices, or audited accounts with a bank,
 - (iii) studying e.g. letter from the school, college or university and evidence of sufficient funds; or
 - (iv) self-sufficient e.g. bank statements.

Family members of European Economic Area nationals who are studying or financially independent must also provide evidence that the European Economic Area national and any family members hold comprehensive sickness insurance in the UK. This can include a private medical insurance policy, an EHIC card or an S1, S2 or S3 form.

Original documents must not be sent to licensing authorities. If the document copied is a passport, a copy of the following pages should be provided:-

- (i) any page containing the holder's personal details including nationality;
- (ii) any page containing the holder's photograph;
- (iii) any page containing the holder's signature;
- (iv) any page containing the date of expiry; and
- (v) any page containing information indicating the holder has permission to enter or remain in the UK and is permitted to work.

If the document is not a passport, a copy of the whole document should be provided.

Your right to work will be checked as part of your licensing application and this could involve us checking your immigration status with the Home Office. We may otherwise share information with the Home Office. Your licence application will not be determined until you have complied with this guidance.

NOTES ON REGULATED ENTERTAINMENT

In terms of specific regulated entertainments please note that:

- Plays: no licence is required for performances between 08:00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
- Films: no licence is required for 'not-for-profit' film exhibition held in community premises between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day provided that the audience does not exceed 500 and the organiser (a) gets consent to the screening from a person who is responsible for the premises; and (b) ensures that each such screening abides by age classification ratings.
- Indoor sporting events: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000.
- Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman
 wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not
 exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or
 wrestling with one or more martial arts are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an
 indoor sporting event.
- Live music: no licence permission is required for:
 - a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.





Prevention of Crime & Disorder

- 1. The premises shall have installed and maintain a closed circuit television surveillance (CCTV) system which at all times complies with the below requirements:
 - CCTV will be provided in the form a recordable system, capable of providing pictures of evidential quality in all lighting conditions particularly facial recognition;
 - CCTV cameras shall cover all public areas including all entrances and exits and all areas where the sale of alcohol takes place;
 - iii. Equipment must be maintained in good working order, be correctly time and date stamped, recordings must be kept in good working order and kept for a minimum period of 31 days;
 - At all times, whilst the premises is open for licensable activities, there are members of staff able to immediately provide viewable copies of recordings to the police or licensing authority staff upon reasonable request;
 - v. The recording equipment and data storage devices shall be kept in a secure environment and fitted with security functions (such as passwords) to prevent recordings being tampered with;
 - vi. An operational daily log report must be maintained endorsed by signature, indicating the system has been checked and is compliant: in the event of any failings these are to be recorded immediately.
- 2. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made immediately available to police or licensing authority staff upon request. The log must be kept as a bound document with individually numbered pages and be retained for a period of at least 6 months after the last incident recorded. The log must be completed as soon as is possible and within any case within 4 hours of the occurrence and shall record the following:
 - (a) all crimes reported to the venue
 - (b) all ejections of patrons
 - (c) any complaints received concerning crime and disorder
 - (d) any incidents of disorder
 - (e) all seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
 - (f) any faults in a CCTV system, searching equipment or scanning equipment mandated as a condition of the licence
- 3. The premises shall have in place and operate a zero tolerance policy with regard to the use/possession of controlled drugs and psychoactive substances and advertise the same within the premises on posters and similar means. This policy shall specifically include but not be limited to:
 - i. Searching practices upon entry;
 - ii. Dealing with patrons suspected of using drugs on the premises;
 - iii. Scrutiny of spaces including toilets or outside areas;
- iv. Clear expectations of staff roles (including the DPS, managers/supervisors and door supervisors);
- v. Staff training regarding identification of suspicious activity and what action to take;
- vi. The handling of items suspected to be illegal drugs or psychoactive substances
- vii. Steps taken to discourage and disrupt drug use on the premises
- viii. Steps to be taken to inform patrons of the premises drug policy/practices

 A copy of this policy document shall be lodged with the police and licensing authority.
- There shall be no events at the premises that are organised, promoted or advertised by an
 external promoter (i.e. by an individual/organisation not directly related to the management of the
 premises).

Prevention of Public Nuisance

- Clear and legible notices must be prominently displayed at all exits requesting customers to respect local residents and leave the area quietly. These signs shall be a minimum size of 200 x 150 mm.
- Clear and legible notices must be prominently displayed at any area used for smoking requesting customers to respect local residents and use the area quietly. These signs shall be a minimum size of 200 x 150 mm.
- 7. The premises must operate as a restaurant for the sale of alcohol for consumption ON the premises:
 - In which customers must be seated at a table;
 - ii. Which provides substantial table meals that are prepared on the premises and are served and consumed at the table;
 - iii. Where alcohol must not be sold, supplied, or consumed on the premises otherwise than to persons who are taking substantial table meals and provided always that the consumption of alcohol by such persons is ancillary to taking such meals.
 - Service of alcohol shall be by waiter/waitress only.
- For the sale of alcohol for consumption OFF the premises; alcohol must be in a sealed container, and sold in connection with substantial food.
- A written dispersal policy will be formulated and provided to the police and licensing authority which amongst other things details:
 - How patrons leaving the premises shall be directed away from the premises;
 - How patrons will be informed of the services of taxi and private hire operators;
 - What staff will be responsible for supervising those leaving the premises and how they will supervise such persons;
 - · Any 'wind' down periods;
 - Methods to prevent re-entry to the premises;
 - How bottles and glasses will be prevented from being removed from the premises at closing time.
- 10. Except when being used for entry or egress by a patron, all external windows and doors shall be kept shut at all times when music is being played and in any event after 21:00 hours at any other time.
- 11. After 23:00 no persons shall be admitted or re-admitted to the premises, except for persons who have temporarily left the premises to smoke.
- 12. After 23:00 patrons permitted to temporarily leave and then re-enter the premises, e.g. to smoke, shall not be permitted to take drinks or glass containers with them. Notices to that effect will be displayed at the premises exits.

Protection of Children from Harm

- 13. A Challenge 25 scheme shall be operated, whereby any person who appears to be under the age of 25 years of age is required to produce on request an item which meets the mandatory age verification requirement and is either a:
 - Proof of age card bearing the PASS Hologram;
 - Photocard driving licence;
 - Passport; or
 - Ministry of Defence Identity Card.

- 14. The premises shall clearly display signs advising customers that a 'Challenge 25' policy is in force.
- 15. A refusals record shall be maintained at the premises which details all refusals to sell alcohol. Each entry shall, as a minimum, record the date and time of the refusal and the name of the staff member refusing the sale. All entries must be made as soon as possible and in any event within 4 hours of the refusal and the record must be made immediately available to police, trading standards or licensing authority staff upon reasonable request. The refusals record shall either be electronic or maintained in a bound document and retained for at least 12 months from the date of the last entry.

On behalf of the Council's Environment & Street Scene Directorate, I confirm receipt of a copy of your application dated 2 July 2018 that I received on 3rd July 2018 regarding the above mentioned property, in relation to the Licensing objective the Prevention of Public nuisance.

I have made the following representation to the Council's Licensing Section with regard to the Licensing objective - Prevention of Public nuisance:

1. Use of outside seating area.

I am concerned about the potential impact of the proposed use on those residents who live in Landmark House, Barrington Green and Chigwell Lane as customers leave late at night. I believe that that the use of the outside area should be restricted to minimise the amount of disturbance to nearby residents, particularly those above the proposed restaurant.

In order to minimise this disturbance, I would recommend that the following conditions should be added to the operating schedule:

The outside seating area shall not be open to customers for eating or drinking outside the following times: 09.00hrs - 21.00hrs Monday-Sunday.

Reason – In order to prevent a public nuisance to nearby residents.

As the outside area will also have to be used by smokers, after 21.00hrs, and the following condition should also apply:

Between 21.00 hours and when the premises is closed to the public, the outside area shall only be used by customers to smoke. No food or drink to be consumed in the outside area after 21.00 hours.

Reason – In order to prevent a public nuisance to nearby residents.

A member of staff shall ensure that any patrons eating, drinking and/or smoking outside the premises do so in an orderly manner and do not cause a public nuisance.

Reason - In order to prevent a public nuisance to nearby residents.

2. Noise from customers and inside restaurant

It is unclear from the application if there are to be openable windows at the front of the restaurant. If such windows/doors are to be installed, the noise generated by 160 customers will be significant, and therefore I would recommend the following is added to the operating schedule:

All external doors and windows shall be closed by 21.00 hours to minimise the noise from the premises, other than entry and exit of patrons.

Reason – In order to prevent a public nuisance to nearby residents.

I would also recommend the following condition is added, to ensure that customers are aware of the residents close by:

The manager and staff will encourage customers to leave quietly. The premises will post notices to enforce this and these notices are to be clearly visible at all times.

Reason – In order to protect amenity of the area and that of local residents.

3. Use of the area as a bar

From the proposed plan, it would appear that there is a bar area. It is unclear from the application if this will be ancillary to the use of the property as a restaurant, for customers to gather before their meal; or if it will be an "attraction" in its own right and people will enter the property to have a drink, with no intention of having it with a meal.

Obviously the first option is going to have less of an impact than the second, and as such I would recommend the following condition, to ensure that all customers are having a meal, rather than using the premises solely as a bar:

All ON sales of alcohol are to be ancillary to a table meal as defined by Section 159 of the Licensing Act 2003

Reason – In order to protect amenity of the area and that of local residents.

4. Hours of deliveries and refuse collections

No deliveries or refuse collections shall be taken at or despatched from the site outside the hours of 07.00-19.00 hours, Monday-Friday, 08.00-14.00 Saturday nor at any time on Sundays, Bank or Public Holidays.

Reason - In order to protect amenity of the area and that of local residents.

I refer to my letter, dated 16 July 2018, regarding the application dated 2 July 2018 regarding the above mentioned property, in relation to the Licensing objective the Prevention of Public nuisance.

Upon further reflection on the application, I have the following additional recommendation to be made regarding the Prevention of Public Nuisance licencing objective:

Noise from music

Whilst the property is going to only have background music it is important that the volume of any music including the bass content is adjusted accordingly to a level that the structure of the building can adequately contain. This is particularly important with a licensed property with residential properties above, who would be affected by music through the ceiling/floor.

This could be achieved by amending the operating schedule, or a suitable condition e.g.

The Premises Supervisor (or representative) shall monitor the volume of music emanating from the premises and adjust the volume to ensure that any amplified sound or other music from the licensed premises does not cause a public nuisance. The Premises Supervisor (or representative) can ensure that music from the premises does not cause a public nuisance by ensuring that the music is inaudible at the boundary of any properties where the occupiers are likely to be sensitive to noise.

Reason: To ensure that any music and amplified sound from the licensed premises does not cause a public nuisance.

Adjusting the volume of music to a level that is inaudible at any properties where the occupiers are likely to be sensitive to noise is a tighter restriction than required to prevent public nuisance. However, any music that is audible at this point has the potential to cause annovance and lead

to public nuisance, especially late at night at the operational times proposed, even at a very low volume.

Speaker positioning would be important (making sure they are not put into the ceiling, without the addition of adequate sound insulation) as would be the number of speakers in the premises (to improve the distribution of sound)

The advice on inaudibility at the boundary of neighbouring noise sensitive premises has been provided to try and reduce any ambiguity in the condition, and provides the Premises Supervisor with a clear benchmark for compliance. However, I appreciate that with the properties above the site, this may be difficult to assess.

In practical terms, it is possible that the music can be audible beyond this point and this condition still complied with, however the Premises Supervisor would be at risk of causing a public nuisance depending on the circumstances at that time.

In order to minimise the disturbance to neighbours, I would also recommend the following condition regarding external speakers:

No external speakers shall be installed at the premises.

Reason - In order to prevent a public nuisance to nearby residents.


- a) General all four licensing objectives
- -Every supply of alcohol will be made by a personal license holder or a person authorized by a personal licence holders.
- -A suitable evacuation plan in case of emergency is available and displayed.
- b) The prevention of crime and disorder
- CCTV equipment installed. Notice displayed in the customer seating area to advice that CCTV in operation.
- -Cameras sited to observe the entrance and exits doors both inside and outside, the alcohol displays, and floor areas.
- -Cameras on the entrances capture full frame shots of the heads and shoulders of all people entering the premises i.e. capable of identification
- -Provide a linked record of the date, time, and place of any image.
- -Provide good quality images.
- -CCTV shall also cover the outside areas.
- -The records will be retained for a minimum of 31 days and will be made available upon police and enforcement officers request immediately by a trained member of staff trained to operate the system/download images shall be on duty during opening hours.
- -The premises will operate a zero tolera nce policy to illegal drugs.

Drug Policy

We operate a zero tolerance policy with regard to the use/possession of controlled drugs and psychoactive substances. Posters to this effect are displayed in tollets as we believe this id the area such activity will occur.

We do not employ SiA licensed door staff as a matter of course, and as such the searching of customers is not routinely undertaken. However, should we become aware of a problem then the employment of such persons will be considered.

Should we suspect a person using drugs on the premises; then staff will monitor their activity; and if required enter the toilets behind them. If the activity is proven then the person will be asked to leave; and consider calling the police.



As aforementioned we believe the toilets to be the area likely to attract such activity; and staff will regularly check the toilets to ensure they are clean, and check for paraphernalia.

- CCTV will be provided in the form a recordable system, capable of providing pictures of evidential quality in all lighting conditions particularly facial recognition;
- CCTV cameras shall cover all public areas including all entrances and exits and all areas where the sale of alcohol takes place;
- Equipment must be maintained in good working order, be correctly time and date stamped, recordings must be kept in good working order and kept for a minimum period of 31 days;
- At all times, whilst the premises is open for licensable activities, there are members of staff able to immediately provide viewable copies of recordings to the police or licensing authority staff upon reasonable request;
- The recording equipment and data storage devices shall be kept in a secure environment and fitted with security functions (such as passwords) to prevent recordings being tampered with;
- vi. An operational daily log report must be maintained endorsed by signature, indicating the system has been checked and is compliant: in the event of any failings these are to be recorded immediately.

-An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made immediately available to police or licensing authority staff upon request. The log must be kept as a bound document with individually numbered pages and be retained for a period of at least 6 months after the last incident recorded. The log must be completed as soon as is possible and within any case within 4 hours of the occurrence and shall record the following:

- (a) all crimes reported to the venue
- (b) all ejections of patrons
- (c) any complaints received concerning crime and disorder
- (d) any incidents of disorder
- (e) all seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
- (f) any faults in a CCTV system, searching equipment or scanning equipment mandated as a condition of the licence

- -Between 21.00 hours and when the premises is closed to the public, the outside area shall only be used by customers to smoke. No food or drink to be consumed in the outside area after 21.00 hours.
- -The Premises Supervisor (or representative) shall monitor the volume of music emanating from the premises and adjust the volume to ensure that any amplified sound or other music from the licensed premises does not cause a public nuisance. The Premises Supervisor (or representative) can ensure that music from the premises does not cause a public nuisance by ensuring that the music is inaudible at the boundary of any properties where the occupiers are likely to be sensitive to noise.
- -No external speakers shall be installed at the premises.
- -Waste collection arrangements done and collecting regularly.
- -No deliveries or refuse collections shall be taken at or despatched from the site outside the hours of 07.00-19.00 hours, Monday-Friday, 08.00-14.00 Saturday nor at any time on Sundays, Bank Holidays or Public Holidays.
- -No self-service for the alcoholic drinks will be available.
- -Prominent, clear and legible notices shall be displayed at all public exits from the premises requesting customers respect the needs of local residents and leave the premises and area quietly. These notices shall be positioned at eye level and a location where those leaving the premises can read them.
- Empty glasses will be removed from the tables after they emptied.
- -The restaurant frontage and the rear will be kept clean and tidy at all times.
- -Clear and legible notices must be prominently displayed at all exits requesting customers to respect local residents and leave the area quietly. These signs shall be a minimum size of 200 x 150 mm.
- -Clear and legible notices must be prominently displayed at any area used for smoking requesting customers to respect local residents and use the area quietly. These signs shall be a minimum size of 200 x 150 mm.
- -The premises must operate as a restaurant for the sale of alcohol for consumption ON the premises:
 - i. In which customers must be seated at a table;
 - ii. Which provides substantial table meals that are prepared on the premises and are served and consumed at the table;
 - iii. Where alcohol must not be sold, supplied, or consumed on the premises otherwise than to persons who are taking substantial table meals and provided always that the consumption of alcohol by such persons is ancillary to taking such meals.
 - iv. Service of alcohol shall be by waiter/waitress only.

- -After 23:00 no persons shall be admitted or re-admitted to the premises, except for persons who have temporarily left the premises to smoke.

Dispersal Policy

Should this not work; or persons become confrontational staff will retreat to the safety of the restaurant; and police called.

We will hold details of local taxi and private hire operators, and should a customer request a taxi, then we will happily call a local firm on their behalf; or provide the number accordingly.

Staff will monitor the exits and ensure safe passage away from the premises for customers:

The sale of alcohol ceases 30 minutes prior to closing; enabling customers to comfortably finish their food and drink before closing and being asked to leave.

Should a person be asked to leave; and they return when unwanted, staff will call police to request assistance in removing the person from the area.

Whilst we acknowledge customers may wish to leave the premises to smoke; they will be asked by staff to leave their drinks at the table. Glasses and bottles will be promptly removed from tables at the end of service to prevent customers taking them with them.

Licensing Application -- Zara Bar & Grill, 30 Barrington Green, Loughton, Essex IG10 2BA

I refer to your letter dated 25th June 2018 outlining details of the Licence application received regarding the above Turkish restaurant. I wish to raise objections on the grounds of preventing public nuisance.

As you are aware, this is a new development and we consider that:

- 1. Limitations need to be included regarding the supply and consumption of alcohol;
- 2. Public access to the backyard service areas is restricted.

We purchased one of the flats in Landmark House last year for my daughter to live in. At the time of purchase the searches contained notice that potential use would be for licenced premises. However, the searches at the time for the hours of licence were not for the hours now being sought.

My daughter is a trainee nurse at Great Ormond Street and so works unsocial hours. It is important that she can sleep at nights after long shifts and is not subjected to general disturbance which may arise. We are therefore concerned that noise levels will be excessive, will continue too late and after the allotted times and lead to public nuisance to surrounding properties, including our own.

While we do not object to the granting of a licence, which we were aware of from the initial searches, I am aware of other similar restaurants in Epping Forest that have general limitations applied to them under the terms of their licence to help contain the noise and public disturbance aspects.

These include restricting the time that alcohol is allowed including Friday and Saturday nights, so that this can only continue behind closed doors to limit the impact on immediate neighbours. The consumption of alcohol is restricted so that it remains only in contained spaces and so that any associated noise or impacts are strictly contained within the licenced premises and do not stray onto the surrounding areas. This helps contain the impacts to public nuisance and is generally positively received by neighbours to the affected premises as well as local police in the event they are called out to deal with any disturbance that might arise. It is particularly important in this case to prevent any potential public nuisance aspects from straying to the back access yards of the property which are directly below the flat we own.

As this is a new development this is "prevention rather cure" and concerns may appear hypothetical. However, I would ask that you consider this application request based on the experience of other similar developments, and also the specific nuances of the development which suggests that precautionary measures taken now will help safeguard the situation to the benefit of all concerned. Hopefully you will feel the concerns raised and solutions proposed are reasonable given the circumstances.

I therefore ask for your consideration of these aspects when reviewing the licence application. I am happy to discuss further as required.

I am objecting to this application upon the following grounds:

- Protection of children from harm we have two children, one aged 21 months and one aged two months the increased noise levels, heat and food aromas will prevent my children from a peaceful night's sleep. We
 must open our windows from April-October due to the heat in the flats and this will magnify the problem
 further
- Public nuisance there is the distinct possibility that customers of the venue will frequent the premises under the influence of alcohol which may lead to a number of disturbances
- Increase in waste food waste will increase significantly, raising concerns around it's storage and the attraction of vermin

Dear Licencing Office,

It is a pleasure to move into Epping Forest Council and I look forward to becoming a helpful and active member of my local community.

I would like to discuss a licence application that came to my attention yesterday afternoon (28th July 2018), verbally by a neighbour that I believe has a direct and potentially devastating impact on my quality of life, enjoyment of my property, emotional wellbeing and job performance. I did not receive any notice of this licence via post as my neighbours have done so, and so I have not thus far had the opportunity to object; I hope that you will accept this letter as my formal objection.

I purchased Landmark House on 29th March 2018 and plan to move in on 5th August 2018; my move in has been significantly delayed by the poor workmanship performed by Higgins Homes (land developers) leading to multiple 'snagging' issues and additionally, I needed to order and wait for all of my furniture to arrive. I do attend weekly to pick up post and ensure the property is in good working order. I was at my property yesterday so that Higgins could fix a leaking balcony issue, which happened because Higgins did not adequately seal the ceilings apparently.

I went to have a look at the notices pinned to the properties below and I have come to understand that the retail units that are directly beneath my home (30 Barrington Green and 32 Barrington Green, IG10 2BX) are two businesses. They are planning to apply for a licence for the Sale of Alcohol, Regulated Entertainment, Recorded/Live Music, Performance of Dance. These activities are expected to last from the morning time to 1am at night, almost daily. There is also an application for Outdoor Seating as far as I am aware.

I am an Anaesthetist, in the final two years of my training. I am due to start my job in Cardiothoracic Anaesthesia at St Bartholomew's Hospital on 1st August 2018. Prior to this, I have spent a year at University College London Hospitals. I have worked in the NHS since 2006 and have given just over 12 years of continuous service to our communities all over London. My job is high stakes, holds enormous responsibility as I am sure you can imagine and is completely reliant on me having had adequate and good quality rest in between shifts. I work in Intensive Care, the Labour Ward and in Theatres, I am frequently involved in life-threatening emergencies which require decisive and quick practical action. I cannot be expected to uphold this level of commitment and dedication if I am frequently kept awake by noise and clientele disruption by the businesses below; it is simply incompatible with my life.

I made the decision to purchase Landmark House on its merits of being in a fantastic location, the quiet local area and I was told by Higgins Homes that the retail units directly below my property would be used for "shops". In fact, I was told a Co-op supermarket was being opened which I distinctly remember discussing with Higgins Sales Negotiator (Mr Chris Charnley) as being very convenient for groceries. I am beyond devastated by the level of deception employed by Higgins Homes and simply do not believe that they did not know that a

bar/club/restaurant would be opening directly underneath my home at the time of completion; 29th March 2018, a mere 4 months ago. I would never have made the commitment to a 30 year mortgage if I had been given this knowledge. I just would not have brought this property.

My whole home - my living room, my bedroom and my balcony are directly above 30 and 32 Barrington Green. There is no part of my property that is not directly impacted by these businesses.

- 1) The noise of customers, the 'buzz' of business, chairs, people moving around, loud/live/recorded music will disrupt my quality of life, enjoyment of my property, emotional wellbeing, quality of sleep and job performance.
- 2) The constant smell of cooked food and alcohol is not compatible with my life; I am a Muslim by background and I am teetotal. I find the smell of alcohol nauseating. The smells of alcohol and cooked meats especially will directly impact my enjoyment of my property and emotional wellbeing.
- 3) The outdoor seating and potential loitering of customers after opening hours means that there will always be people just below my bedroom windows and my balcony. This impacts my enjoyment of my property, my sleep and it will make me feel very very unsafe. I will not feel confident to open my windows and/or use my balcony. I will fear a break-in, which may sound catastrophic but this my very real and very valid fear.

Please know that I shift work. This means I have a wide variety of different potential working hours as outlined below

- On a 'Long Day' I work until 9pm. I arrive home at 10pm. I need to get up again the next morning at 05.30am for a 07.30am start
- On a 'Night' I work between 7.30pm and 08.00am. I arrive home around 09.00am and then have to be back at work again later that evening for another night shift. This means I have to sleep during the daytime; in addition to the difficulty of adjusting to working at night, it is imperative that my daytime sleep is of high quality. Living above a restaurant/bar is not compatible with this.
- On a 'normal' working day I wake up at 05.30am, leave the house at 06.30am to be at work for 07.30am. Being kept awake until 1am is just not acceptable.
- I work weekends as well as weekdays, so all of the above is applicable to Saturdays and Sundays.

I hope that you can see that the impact of these businesses will make itself known all day and every day. I simply cannot escape from just how bad it will potentially be.

I object to these licence applications to the highest degree possible.

I hope that you will help guide me on how I can present my case to all those involved and be heard as an individual who will be significantly and devastatingly impacted by all of the above.

There are always a number of loiterers each and every day and night around the Barrington Green area which makes me and my family nervous that this Turkish Restaurant could potentially attract more of these types of people.

A Turkish Restaurant situated beside Landmark House apartments will cause huge disruptions and will make living in landmark house noisy and unpleasant. There is also no suitable parking anywhere near Landmark house so we feel this will create a problem for the roads, as intoxicated people will be leaving their cars over night or even worse drive whilst under the influence.

I strongly urge you to decline this application on the grounds of my points above.
