
### **DPA Context**

- Eight tube stations
- Borders three Met Boroughs
- Four major road networks
- 80% of suspects live outside of the DPA
- 2 CSPs
- Mixture of rural and urban











#### Performance

• April – August 2015 = 3222 crimes

• April – August 2016 = 3530 crimes

Increase of 9.5% (308 crimes)



# Violence Against the Person

Without Injury – increase in 24%

With Injury – increase in 32%

Approx. 30% of violent crime occurs in the home



## **Acquisitive Crime**

- Dwelling Burglary 16 % decrease
- Theft from a Motor Vehicle –5.6 % decrease
- Theft of a motor vehicle 5.1 %increase
- Robbery 25.7% decrease


• 3.4 % increase in offences (66 more offences)

# Problem Solving Team and Community Hub

- September 2014 establish CPT Hub
- Problem Solving Team
- Triage process
- Partnership engagement (Tasking, Vetting)



#### **Hub Priorities**

- Priority 1 Hidden Harm, Domestic Abuse, CSE, Hate Crime, Vulnerable Victims
- Priority 2 Reducing Reoffending, NTE, Serious Sexual Crime, Serious Violent Crime
- Priority 3 Tackling Anti-Social Behaviour Identifying and supporting repeat and vulnerable victims, improving public perceptions and facilitating multi agency local problem solving to address issues.
- **Priority 4** Acquisitive Crime, NHW, Active Citizen, CPTA



# Partnership Working

- Case Study ASB
  - Vulnerable adult male with Mental health issues, repeat victim and suspect for ASB
  - Taken to Hub Tasking by police due to number of ASB reports from the address
  - Cuckooing by female drug user, started using his address as a base for criminal activity
  - Hub instigate a Closure Order
  - Female arrested, male safeguarded, MH support
