Licensing Committee - Terms of Reference

- (1) The full Committee shall comprise 15 Councillors appointed by the Council at it's annual meeting, including a Chairman and Vice-Chairman.
- (2) For the functions set out in Appendix 1, and the legislation listed in Appendix 2, a sub-committee consisting of no more than any three Councillors drawn from the members of the full Committee shall be formed. Any such sub-committee shall include, by rota, one of the six Licensing Sub-Committee Chairmen appointed at each Annual Council meeting.
- (3) The Quorum for the Committee is set out in the Rules set out in Part 4 of this Constitution save that no business shall be transacted unless either the Chairman or Vice-Chairman of the Committee is present.
- (4) The Committee and sub-committees shall have full authority to hear and determine licensing applications.
- (5) The Committee and sub-committees shall be further empowered to determine appeals made against the decisions of the Service Director (Commercial and Regulatory Services) taken under delegated authority on licensing applications. (See Council delegation schedule for more details)
- (6) The Committee shall at all times carry out its duties solely within the policy from time to time determined by the Council and shall conduct its proceedings in accordance with the requirements set out in Appendix 3 (Conduct of Business by Licensing Committee and Sub-Committees).
- (7) The Licensing Committee shall take no part in the production or revision of the statement of licensing policy made under Section 5 of the Licensing Act 2003, however, they may determine policy under the legislation listed in Appendix 2 to this Article.
- (8) To be responsible for the consideration and approval of Designation Orders under Section 13 of the Criminal Justice and Police Act 2001 (Exercise of Controls over the consumption of alcohol in Public Places).

PART A – CONDUCT OF BUSINESS BY LICENSING COMMITTEE AND SUB-COMMITTEES

All references to committee in this annex shall be taken to infer a reference to the associated subcommittees.

1. General Conduct

- 1.1 All hearings of the Licensing Committee under the Licensing Act 2003, are to be held in accordance with the Personal Licences, Hearings, Premises Licences and Club Premises Certificates, and Licensing Register Regulations, made under the Licensing Act 2003.
- 1.2 The Council's Constitution shall regulate the conduct of and debate at meetings.
- 1.3 In the case of hearings under the Licensing Act 2003, the Committee shall only consider those matters relevant to the licensing objectives as set out in the Licensing Act 2003 and the statement of licensing policy adopted by the Council.

2. Declarations of Interest

2.1 Members of the Committee are subject to the Council's Code of Conduct.

3. Participation in the Hearing

- 3.1 Debate shall be restricted to members of the Licensing Committee. Where a local ward member, not being a member of the Committee, wishes to participate in the hearing, they may do so only with the permission of the Chairman and their participation shall be subject to the same rules as are applied to any other witnesses to the application.
- 3.2 In hearings other than those under the Licensing Act 2003, where a ward member is a member of the Committee, and wishes to object to the application, the member shall give 14 days' notice of their intention, and shall play no part in the decision-making process of the Committee. In hearings under the Licensing Act 2003, those named as responsible authorities and interested parties in the Act may only make representations within the time limits set out in the relevant statutory provisions.
- 3.3 All persons participating in the hearing shall be made aware of the limitations or scope of statements that will be acceptable and, in particular, that statements should be factual or a fair statement on a matter of public interest.
- 3.4 In the case of any hearing pursuant to the summary review procedure under the Violent Crime Reduction Act 2006, the membership of any Subcommittee adjudicating on such a review shall comprise any three members drawn from the Licensing Committee subject to the proviso that no member should serve more than one hearing.

4. Attendance of the Public

4.1 The Council's Constitution and relevant statutory provisions relating to the admission or exclusion of the public shall apply to all meetings of the Licensing Committee.

5. Natural Justice

5.1 There are two elements to natural justice:

(a) Fairness

- (i) All persons affected by the decision or in the case of matters associated with the Licensing Act 2003, those named as responsible authorities and interested parties in the Act, will be allowed a hearing before a decision is made.
- (ii) Only objectors who can show clearly that they are affected by a decision shall be afforded the right to be heard or, in the case of hearings under the Licensing Act 2003, only those named in the Act as responsible authorities or interested parties.
- (iii) All information shall be made available, where possible in advance, to the applicant and the Committee.
- (iv) All members of the Committee shall be present throughout the hearing of a particular application. Where a member arrives late or leaves during a hearing of a particular application, that member shall play no part in the decision-making process. Where an application is adjourned it shall be continued by the same members only, and no others.
- (v) The Committee shall have discretion in respect of 'late' objections. Such objections shall be clearly marked on the agenda as such and the Committee shall decide on their acceptability. The applicant shall be advised of any late objections. In the case of representations made in relation to the Licensing Act 2003 applications, these shall only be accepted in accordance with the relevant statutory provisions.

(b) Prevention of Bias

- (i) The rules on the declarations of interest shall be firmly applied.
- (ii) If the Committee moves into private session to consider its decision, it shall be accompanied only by its advising officers, none of whom shall have taken a substantive part in the hearing, and shall play no substantive part in the decision-making process.

6. General Procedures for Hearings

- 6.1 The following procedural requirements shall be followed at all times:
 - (a) There shall be no recommendation from officers on the agenda;
 - (b) The Committee shall be supplied with copies of all relevant documentation and the process and order of procedure shall be as follows:

- (i) The Chairman will open the meeting and introduce persons as appropriate asking applicants and representatives to identify themselves.
- (ii) The Chairman will outline the procedure to be followed.
- (iii) The Lead Officer will outline the matter in hand.
- (iv) The applicant or representative will present his/her case, with or without witnesses, and be questioned by members or any objectors/persons making representations present.
- (v) Any objectors/persons making representations may then present their objections/representation, with or without witnesses, and be questioned by members or the applicant/s or their representative.
- (vi) The objectors/persons making representations may make a final statement (without introducing new issues).
- (vii) Finally, the applicant has the right to make a final statement (without introducing new issues).
- (viii) All evidence/disclosures are to be made in the presence of all persons, unless someone voluntarily excuses themselves from the proceedings.
- (ix) Committee members shall restrict themselves to questions and not discussion or comment.
- (x) The applicant, objectors/persons making representations shall be allowed to ask officers questions of a technical/factual nature at any time during the proceedings.
- (xi) An adjournment should be granted where to do otherwise would deny a fair hearing.
- (xii) The Committee may resolve to decide upon the application in private session, however, if it becomes necessary to recall anyone for additional information, everyone shall be invited to return to the Hearing.
- (xiii) The decision shall be given in the presence of all parties that wish to be present and confirmed in writing as soon as possible thereafter. If legal advice is given to members this advice will be repeated in summary form.

Decisions Required:

To consider an application for a Premises Licence under the Licensing Act 2003, with regard to Harley's Bistro and Lounge, 184 High Street, Epping.

Application

- 1. An application has been made by Ugur Kesen of Harley's Bistro and Lounge, for a new premises licence at 184 High Street, Epping, Essex, CM16 4AQ. The application is for the following licensing activities:
 - (a) the sale by retail of alcohol on the premises only from Monday to Sunday from 10.00 to 22.30; and
 - (b) the opening times of the premises are from Monday to Sunday from 07.00 to 23.00.
- 2. The application was received on 16 July 2019 and is attached as an appendix to this report, together with a plan of the premises.
- 3. The Operating Schedule sets out conditions which will be attached to the licence if this application is granted.

Licensing Act 2003

- 4. When considering an application for a licence, the licensing authority must have regard to steps that are appropriate to the promotion of the licensing objectives. These are:
 - (a) the prevention of crime and disorder:
 - (b) public safety:
 - (c) the prevention of public nuisance; and
 - (d) the protection of children from harm.
- 5. The licensing authority must also have regard to its Statement of Licensing Policy and any guidance issued by the Secretary of State.

Consultation

6. The responsible authorities have all been consulted with regard to the application, which was also advertised at the premises and in a local newspaper. A copy of the public notice and newspaper publication is also attached as an appendix to this report.

- 7. All residences and businesses situated within a radius of 150 metres of the premises have been individually consulted on the application. The Council has received one representation from a local resident with regard to the application, which is also attached to this report. This objection to the application relates to the prevention of crime and disorder, the prevention of public nuisance, public safety and the protection of children from harm.
- 8. Essex Police have made no representations in respect of the application.

Guidance Issued by the Secretary of State

9. The Licensing Act 2003 provides that the licensing authority must 'have regard to' guidance issued by the Secretary of State under Section 182 of the Act. Sections 2.15 to 2.21 of the Guidance are relevant to this application.

Options

- 10. In determining the application, the Sub-Committee may take any of the following steps as it considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives, namely:
 - (a) to grant the licence as applied for subject to:
 - the conditions mentioned in the Operating Schedule modified as the Subcommittee considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives, and
 - (ii) the mandatory conditions specified in the Licensing Act 2003, or
 - (b) to exclude from the scope of the licence any licensable activities to which the application relates, or
 - (c) to refuse to specify a person as the premises supervisor, or
 - (d) to reject the application.

Determination

- 11. The Sub-Committee is asked to determine the application having regard to:
 - (a) the content of this report and representations;
 - (b) any additional information obtained from the hearing;
 - (c) the Council's statement of licensing policy;
 - (d) guidance issued by the Secretary of State, and
 - (e) the steps appropriate to promote the licensing objectives.

Appeal

12. If any party is aggrieved with the decision of the Sub-Committee with regard to the application, they can appeal to the Magistrates Court. The appeal period is twenty-one days from the notification of the decision.

-Every supply of alcohol will be made by a personal license holder or a person authorized by a personal licence holders.
-A suitable evacuation plan in case of emergency is available and displayed.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

- The premises shall have installed and maintain a closed circuit television surveillance (CCTV) system which at all times complies with the below requirements:
- i. CCTV will be provided in the form a recordable system, capable of providing pictures of evidential quality in all lighting conditions particularly facial recognition;
- ii. CCTV cameras shall cover all public areas including all entrances and exits and all areas where the sale of alcohol takes place;
- iii. Equipment must be maintained in good working order, be correctly time and date stamped, recordings must be kept in good working order and kept for a minimum period of 31 days;
- iv. At all times, whilst the premises is open for licensable activities, there are members of staff able to immediately provide viewable copies of recordings to the police or licensing authority staff upon reasonable request;
- v. The recording equipment and data storage devices shall be kept in a secure environment and fitted with security functions (such as passwords) to prevent recordings being tampered with;
- vi. An operational daily log report must be maintained endorsed by signature, indicating the system has been checked and is compliant: in the event of any failings these are to be recorded immediately.
- -An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made immediately available to police or licensing authority staff upon request. The log will be kept as a bound document with individually numbered pages and be retained for a period of at least 6 months after the last incident recorded. The log will be completed as soon as is possible and within any case within 4 hours of the occurrence and shall record the following:
- (a) all crimes reported to the venue
- (b) all ejections of patrons
- (c) any complaints received concerning crime and disorder
- (d) any incidents of disorder
- (e) all seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
- (f) any faults in a CCTV system, searching equipment or scanning equipment mandated as a condition of the licence.
- -The premises shall have in place and operate a zero tolerance policy with regard to the use/possession of controlled drugs and psychoactive substances and advertise the same within the premises on posters and similar means. This policy shall specifically include but not be limited to:
- Searching practices upon entry;
- ii. Dealing with patrons suspected of using drugs on the premises:
- iii. Scrutiny of spaces including toilets or outside areas;
- liv. Clear expectations of staff roles (including the DPS, managers/supervisors and door supervisors);
- v. Staff training regarding identification of suspicious activity and what action to take:
- vi. The handling of items suspected to be illegal drugs or psychoactive substances
- vii. Steps taken to discourage and disrupt drug use on the premises
- viii. Steps to be taken to inform patrons of the premises drug policy/practices
- A copy of this policy document shall be lodged with the police and licensing authority.
- -The premises will operate a zero tolerance policy to illegal drugs.
- c) Public safety

Health and Safety risk assessment will be in place.

-Fire risk assessment will be in place.

- -Adequate fire fighting equipment will be provided and staff trained in fire prevention, emergency procedures and the use of fire fighting equipment. Emergency lighting and fire extinguishers installed on the premises.
- -Fire equipments will be maintained periodically.
- -Fire exits will be kept clear all the times
- -Suitable first -aid kit available.
- -For safety and security reasons there will be shutters at the front.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

- -Clear and legible notices will be prominently displayed at all exits requesting customers to respect local residents and leave the area quietly. These signs shall be a minimum size of 200 x 150 mm.
- -These notices shall be positioned at eye level and a location where those leaving the premises can read them.
- -Clear and legible notices will be prominently displayed at any area used for smoking requesting customers to respect local residents and use the area quietly. These signs shall be a minimum size of 200 x 150 mm.
- -The premises will operate as a restaurant for the sale of alcohol for consumption ON the premises:
- i.In which customers will be seated at a table:
- ii. Which will be provided substantial table meals that are prepared on the premises and are served and consumed at the table:
- iii. Alcohol will not be sold, supplied, or consumed on the premises otherwise than to persons who are taking substantial table meals and provided always that the consumption of alcohol by such persons is ancillary to taking such meals.
- iv. Service of alcohol shall be by waiter/waitress only. No self service for the alcoholic drinks will be available.
- v.Empty glasses will be removed from the tables after they emptied.
- -A written dispersal policy will be formulated and provided to the police and licensing authority which amongst other things details:
- How patrons leaving the premises shall be directed away from the premises;
- · How patrons will be informed of the services of taxi and private hire operators;
- · What staff will be responsible for supervising those leaving the premises and how they will supervise such persons;
- Any 'wind' down periods;
- Methods to prevent re-entry to the premises:
- How bottles and glasses will be prevented from being removed from the premises at closing time.
- -Except when being used for entry or egress by a patron, all external windows and doors shall be kept shut at all times when music is being played and in any event after 21:00 hours at any other time.
- 11. After 22:30 no persons shall be admitted or re-admitted to the premises, except for persons who have temporarily left the premises to smoke.
- 12. After 22:30 patrons permitted to temporarily leave and then re-enter the premises, e.g. to smoke, shall not be permitted to take drinks or glass containers with them. Notices to that effect will be displayed at the premises exits.
- -Waste collection arrangements done and collecting regularly.
- -The restaurant frontage and the rear will be kept clean and tidy at all times.

e) The protection of children from harm

- -A Challenge 25 scheme shall be operated, whereby any person who appears to be under the age of 25 years of age is required to produce on request an item which meets the mandatory age verification requirement and is either a:
- Proof of age card bearing the PASS Hologram;
- Photocard driving licence;
- Passport; or
- Ministry of Defence Identity Card.
- -The premises shall clearly display signs advising customers that a 'Challenge 25' policy is in force.
- -A refusals record shall be maintained at the premises which details all refusals to sell alcohol. Each entry shall, as a minimum, record the date and time of the refusal and the name of the staff member refusing the sale. All entries will be made as soon as possible and in any event within 4 hours of the refusal and the record will be made immediately available to police, trading standards or licensing authority staff upon reasonable request. The refusals record shall either be electronic or maintained in a bound document and retained for at least 12 months from the date of the last entry.

NOTES ON DEMONSTRATING ENTITLEMENT TO WORK IN THE UK

Entitlement to work/immigration status for individual applicants and applications from partnerships which are not limited liability partnerships:

A licence may not be held by an individual or an individual in a partnership who is resident in the UK who:

- A certificate of registration or naturalisation as a British citizen, when produced in combination with an
 official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a
 Government agency or a previous employer.

- A current passport endorsed to show that the holder is allowed to stay in the UK and is currently allowed to
 work and is not subject to a condition preventing the holder from doing work relating to the carrying on of a
 licensable activity.
- A current Biometric Immigration Document (Biometric Residence Permit) issued by the Home Office to the holder which indicates that the named person can currently stay in the UK and is allowed to work relation to the carrying on of a licensable activity.
- A current Residence Card issued by the Home Office to a person who is not a national of a European Economic
 Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights or
 residence.
- A current Immigration Status Document containing a photograph issued by the Home Office to the holder
 with an endorsement indicating that the named person may stay in the UK, and is allowed to work and is not
 subject to a condition preventing the holder from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity

- Reasonable evidence that the person has an outstanding application to vary their permission to be in the UK with the Home Office such as the Home Office acknowledgement letter or proof of postage evidence, or reasonable evidence that the person has an appeal or administrative review pending on an immigration decision, such as an appeal or administrative review reference number.
- Reasonable evidence that a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but
 who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights of residence in exercising treaty rights in
 the UK including:-
 - evidence of the applicant's own identity such as a passport,
 - evidence of their relationship with the European Economic Area family member e.g. a marriage certificate, civil partnership certificate or birth certificate, and
 - evidence that the European Economic Area national has a right of permanent residence in the UK or is one of the following if they have been in the UK for more than 3 months:

Home Office online right to work checking service

As an alternative to providing a copy of the documents listed above, applicants may demonstrate their right to work by allowing the licensing authority to carry out a check with the Home Office online right to work checking service.

- Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman
 wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not
 exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or
 wrestling with one or more martial arts are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an
 indoor sporting event.
- Live music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:

 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.

- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
 - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
 - o any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.





Recommendations/Decisions Required:

To consider an application for the variation of an existing Premises Licence under the Licensing Act 2003, with regard to Efezade, 12-14 The Broadway, Loughton.

Application

- 1. An application has been made by Cuma Erdogan for a variation to the premises licence for Efezade, 12-14 The Broadway, Loughton.
- 2. The application is for the following licensable activities:
 - (a) hours the premises will be open to the public Monday to Sunday from 07:30am to 01:00am;
 - (b) supply of alcohol Monday to Sunday from 10:00am to 01:00am;
 - (c) recorded music Monday to Sunday from 10:00am to 01:00am; and
 - (d) late night refreshment Monday to Sunday from 23:00pm to 01:00am.
- 3. The application was received on 1 August 2019. A copy of the present licence for the premises, the application for variation and the public notice are attached as an appendix to this report.

Licensing Act 2003

- 4. When considering an application for a licence, the licensing authority must have regard to steps that are appropriate to the promotion of the licensing objectives. These are:
 - (a) the prevention of crime and disorder;
 - (b) public safety;
 - (c) the prevention of public nuisance; and
 - (d) the protection of children from harm.
- 5. The licensing authority must also have regard to its Statement of Licensing Policy and any guidance issued by the Secretary of State.

Consultation

6. The responsible authorities have all been consulted with regard to the application, which was properly advertised at the premises and in a local newspaper.

- 7. The Council has received eighteen representations to the application, from the Council's Environmental Enforcement Team, Loughton Town Council, Loughton Residents Association and local residents. Essex Police and the council's Environmental Health Team have raised no objections to the application.
- 8. The representations made in respect of the application relate to the prevention of crime and disorder, public safety, the prevention of public nuisance and the protection of children from harm.
- 9. The Service Director (Planning Services) has advised that planning permission for a change of use (EPF/3136/16) to A3 use for the application premises currently has a condition that restricts the opening hours for members of the public until 23:00 and that the applicant would need to apply for a variation of the existing planning permission. Whilst the Sub-Committee will be aware that licensing does not take planning legislation into consideration, this information has been passed onto the applicant and is included in this report for information only.

Guidance Issued by the Secretary of State

10. The Licensing Act 2003 provides that the licensing authority must 'have regard to' guidance issued by the Secretary of State under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003. Sections 2.1 to 2.32 of the Guidance are relevant to this application.

Options

- 11. In determining the application, the Sub-Committee may take any of the following steps as it considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives, namely:
 - (a) to modify the conditions of the licence; or
 - (b) to reject the whole or part of the application.
- 12. For the purposes of the Licensing Act 2003, the conditions of the licence are modified if any of them are altered or omitted or a new condition added.

Determination

- 13. The Sub-Committee is asked to determine the application having regard to:
 - (a) the content of this report and representations;
 - (b) any additional information obtained from the hearing;
 - (c) the Council's statement of licensing policy;
 - (d) guidance issued by the Secretary of State, and
 - (e) the steps appropriate to promote the licensing objectives.

Appeal

14. If any party is aggrieved with the decision of the Sub-Committee with regard to the application, they can appeal to the Magistrates Court. The appeal period is twenty-one days from the notification of the decision.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule:

The Prevention of Crime and Disorder.

The current Security measures will remain in operation, and all the staff will be fully trained in this area. Sufficient staff will be on duty at all busy times and staff will refuse entry to any customer who in their opinion appears to be intoxicated. CCTV cameras will be in operation during the opening hours and also for a period of 2 hours after the premises closes. The time and date stamp will be correct at the time of all recordings and will be generated onto both recorded and real time images. A camera will record clear images of all customers from the waist and above at the entrance and exit of the premise. Recordings will be maintained for 31 days and, in the event of an incident or investigation of an offence, will be available for Police and or Responsible Authorities to view on request and will be downloaded onto a removable format and will be provided to Police and or Responsible Authorities within 48 hours of a request.

In the event of a technical failure, the premises licence holder will ensure that the DPS, or other named person in their absence, informs the Licensing Authority and Police as soon as is reasonably practicable. This information will be contemporaneously recorded in the incident register and will include the time, date, and means that this was done and also to whom the information was reported to. Equipment failures will be repaired without undue delay and the Licensing Authority and the Police will be informed when the fault is rectified.

The managers will develop and maintain a good relationship with the Police, neighbours to the premises and the Licensing Authority to ensure that the business becomes a valuable entity within the community.

Alcohol sales will be by waiter/waitress to a customer who is seated at a table and consumed at the table. Save for takeaway orders which must be ancillary to food ordered for takeaway. No vertical drinking shall be permitted.

Public Safety

The premises will operate to a high standard and will continue to do so in terms of the sale of alcohol. All staff will be fully trained in their responsibilities with regard to the sale of alcohol. Staff will be re-trained every 6 months with recorded training records kept for inspection. The DPS will maintain a DPS written authorisation sheet which will show the names of staff members who have been given delegated authority to authorise the sale of alcohol. Staff will be trained to be alert to any potential danger to customers and react accordingly, if they are unable to quickly diffuse the situation without risk to customer or staff they are then instructed to call the police. Effective management and supervision of the premises will be maintained at all times. The premises will comply with all current Health and Safety and Fire legislation. There will be no smoking on the premises and free drinking water will be made available upon request. There will be access to licensed taxi and private hire services for customers if required.

Prevention of Public nuisance

Customers will be requested to leave the premises in a quiet and orderly manner, a sign will also be displayed asking customers to leave the premises quietly.

The Protection of children from harm

Only photographic ID is acceptable (passport, driving licence, proof of age card with PASS hologram and Military ID) If a customer appears to be under the age of 25, then they will be challenged to provide ID. If the customer is unable to provide recognised identification then no sale of alcohol will be made. If it becomes known that a customer intends to purchase alcohol with the intention to supply to a minor then that sale must be refused. All refused sales of alcohol will be recorded in a refusals book which will be made available for inspection by the Police or Licensing officers of the Local Authority upon request.

On behalf of the Council's Community & Partnerships Directorate, I confirm receipt of a copy of your application dated 3 July 2019, which was re submitted to the Council on 31 July 2019, regarding the above mentioned property, in relation to the Licensing objective the Prevention of Public nuisance.

It would appear that this application is the same as that was received in early July, and to which made representations in my letter, dated 15 July 2019.

My comments in this letter remain the same, but for clarity, I have outlined them again in this letter – and have made the following representation to the Council's Licensing Section with regard to the Licensing objective – Prevention of Public nuisance:

My main concern is that the extension of the licensable hours will go on until 01.00 hours every day of the week. Because of the residential nature of The Broadway, particularly late at night, any noise from the restaurant will cause a public nuisance, particularly in the early hours of the morning.

As such, I cannot support the extension of the hours of opening, due to noise from customers as they leave at 01.00 hours, and the potential for loud recording music, in the early hours.

As you are aware, complaints have been received in the recent past where loud music from Efezade has caused disturbance to residents of The Broadway during the current licensable hours. Whilst I appreciate that you indicate that music after 23.00 hours will be background music only, I do not consider that this is adequate to address the concerns that I have regarding the music causing a public nuisance later in the evening. This is due to the structure of the building, current positioning of the speakers, and the reduction of the background noise levels as the night progresses.

In addition, I am concerned that the noise from customers as they leave the site at 01.00 will cause significant disturbance, from loud voices and vehicle noise. Licenced premises regularly have issues with noise from customers as they leave, and I believe that the lateness of 01.00hours is unacceptable in this location, particularly due to the close proximity to residents above and opposite the site, and that as customers leave in the near vicinity, they are likely to cause a public nuisance.

Similarly, I would not want to see customers sitting outside after 23.00 hours, as this will also cause a public nuisance in the area.

As such, I am unable to recommend the extension of business until 01.00, due to the potential of a public nuisance being caused from amplified music and customers.

If you would like to discuss the matter or have any written comments, please do not hesitate to contact me.

I should be happy to withdraw the representations if the operating schedule is amended or if you agree to suitable condition being imposed as part of the licence, or if you provide sufficient evidence to confirm that the representation can be withdrawn.

Please confirm your comments in writing (by letter or email). I will inform the Council's Licensing Section if satisfied that the representations can be withdrawn.

The application would be detrimental to the amenity of the residents of Landmark House on the following grounds:

We wish to make a representation.

We wish to object to the extension of hours until 01.00hrs, 7 days a week under the prevention of public nuisance section of the Licensing Act 2003.

There is already a noise nuisance from the premises whilst it is open, and if the premises are allowed to play music any longer than 11pm then this would actually make life intolerable for us.

The premises do not, to my knowledge, have sound proofing or noise limiting devises. The building is old (1954) and made of solid concrete which amplifies sound. The building is not designed to contain modern levels of sound and vibration and the noise inevitably escapes from the premises and affects us.

During the day sounds from the restaurant are a nuisance but tolerable. We hear people singing, we hear banging noises (like someone is hammering a nail in the wall) which we think may be associated with the cutting up of meat. But at night, when it is quiet outside, when the music is turned up we have to keep the windows shut, turn up the television and avoid having guests at the weekend when noisy events are held.

We have in the past contacted the Environmental team at the council (Mr Mark Richardson is very aware of the problem). We have complained in person to the manager on one occasion but were told that as he had a license to 11pm there was no obligation to turn the music down. And he didn't. 





Harlow Garden Centre - Conditions Sought

- 1. The premises will have installed and maintained a closed circuit television surveillance (CCTV) system which at all times complies with the below requirements:
 - i. CCTV will be provided in the form a recordable system, capable of providing pictures of evidential quality in all lighting conditions particularly facial recognition;
 - ii. CCTV cameras will cover all public areas including all entrances and exits and all areas where the sale of alcohol takes place;
 - iii. Equipment will be maintained in good working order, be correctly time and date stamped, recordings must be kept in good working order and kept for a minimum period of 31 days;
 - iv. At all times, whilst the premises is open for licensable activities, there are members of staff able to immediately provide viewable copies of recordings to the police or licensing authority staff upon reasonable request;
 - v. The recording equipment and data storage devices will be kept in a secure environment and fitted with security functions (such as passwords) to prevent recordings being tampered with;
 - vi. An operational daily log report will be maintained endorsed by signature, indicating the system has been checked and is compliant: in the event of any failure this will be recorded immediately.
- 2. Signs must be displayed at all entrances advising customers that CCTV is operating at the premises and will be a minimum size of 200x148mm and clearly legible at all times when the premises conducts licensable activities.
- 3. No alcohol may be supplied by an individual unless that individual has the written consent of the Designated Premises Supervisor or other employed Personal Licence Holder. A written record of this consent must be retained on the premises at all times when such an individual supplies or proposes to supply alcohol and be made available immediately upon reasonable request of the police or licensing authority.
- 4. The sale of alcohol for consumption **ON** the premises must only be to customers seated at a table and ancillary to a substantial table meal.
- 5. In addition to water, other non-alcoholic beverages will be available at all times whilst alcohol sale or supply takes place.
- 6. A Challenge 25 scheme will be operated, whereby any person who appears to be under the age of 25 years of age is required to produce on request an item which meets the mandatory age verification requirement and is either a:
 - Proof of age card bearing the PASS Hologram;
 - · Photocard driving licence;
 - Passport; or
 - Ministry of Defence Identity Card.
- 7. The premises will clearly display signs advising customers that a 'Challenge 25' policy is in force.
