2. Introductions and Welcome by Chairman Martin

Martin welcomed Guests, Youth Councillors and officers to the meeting. Diane explained the housekeeping: all Youth Councillors should arrive 15 minutes early for signing in and getting to the room, the muster point in the event of a fire is on the green at the front of the Civic Offices. 3. Guest Speaker Paul Messenger – Town Centre Manager EFDC & Duncan Haslam.

The youth councillors were asked for their ideas about how the future of the High Street will look and how can visitors be attracted to the high streets. The Youth Councillors said;

- They preferred the well-known high-street brands, as they lacked trust with smaller businesses on the high-street.
- Shops need to be online too.
- They would like to see more book shops and more shops near or in schools, as lunch time will create more business for the high-street.
- Build health centres and have G.P.'s near highstreets as people who visit are more likely to pop into the shops in the Highstreet.
- Encourage better known branded shops to attract people shopping locally.
- Improve transport to high streets especially at peak times.

They said that they would you like to see;

Attractions such as pop up shops

- Festivals
- Funfairs
- Fashion shows
- Skate parks
- Promotions
- Create places where young people want to visit with friends.
- Integrate the necessities similar to supermarkets.

4. Epping Forest Youth Conference

Some of the youth councilors who have attended Youth Council Conferences gave feedback about their experience. A discussion took place on whether to limit the number of questions per pupil as this gives more people the opportunity to speak. Youth Conference date is Friday 19th November 2021. The theme will be Climate Change.

- Put pupils at ease but telling them they can ask questions
- A great goody bag, pens, water bottles, T- Shirts

Davenant Foundation school. Archie & Martin, Reported that the One-way system in the corridors is a good thing as stops congestion but the downfall it takes longer to get to lessons. The class and year bubbles have ended.

Debden Park High school, Daniel reported that Matthew has moved to the New City College. Daniel is looking forward to raising his profile in the school.

Epping St. John's school, Sonny reported he has left and will be an independent Youth Councillor. The school are completing a 20 mile walk to promote health and wellbeing raising money for charity.

King Harold Business and Enterprise Academy, Tomor has left and will also be an independent. He starts Harlow College next week. There will be no representation at KHA until the next election.

Roding Valley High school, Frank, Natalie, Bianca and Sydnae reported the Sixth formers have their own building, everything is back to normal. Can only visit certain toilets and long queues for food at breaks.

The Ongar Academy, Finlay reported there is a new headteacher, Mrs Michelle Steadman

West Hatch High school, Aliza & Riya reported there are no longer any restrictions and they have brought in more teachers for the new school year.

With Youth Councillors moving to new schools, there will be no Youth Council representation in 3 of the 9 secondary schools; Braeside, Epping St Johns and King Harold Academy, until the Youth Election in March 2022.
