104. THE CHILDREN'S SOCIETY

Emily Timmins, the Relationship Manager serving East Anglia, at The Children's Society gave a short presentation about the work of the Children's Society charity.

Emily thanked the Youth Council for their outstanding work raising £165 at the Epping Youth Market in the summer.

105. YOUTH CONFERENCE

Di gave an update on the arrangements for the Epping Forest Schools Youth Conference on Friday 3 November 2017.

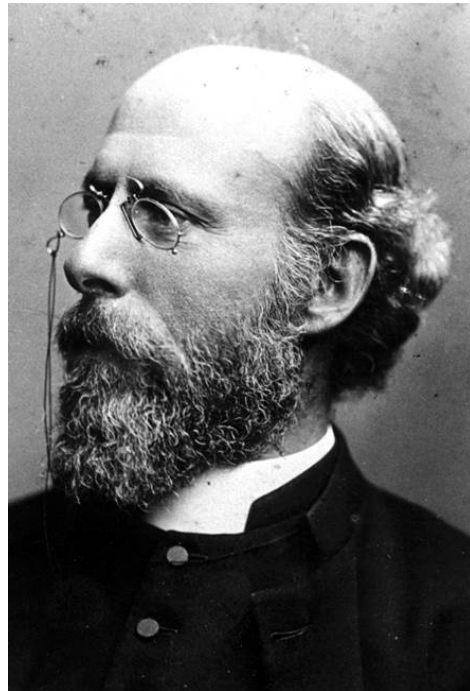
