Licensing Committee - Terms of Reference

(1) The full Committee shall comprise 15 Councillors appointed by the Council at it's annual meeting, including a Chairman and Vice-Chairman.

(2) For the functions set out in Appendix 1, and the legislation listed in Appendix 2, a Subcommittee consisting of no more than any three Councillors drawn from the members of the full Committee shall be formed. Any such Subcommittee shall include, by rota, one of the six Licensing Subcommittee Chairmen appointed at each Annual Council meeting.

(3) The Quorum for the Committee is set out in the Rules set out in Part 4 of this Constitution save that no business shall be transacted unless either the Chairman or Vice-Chairman of the Committee is present.

(4) The Committee and Subcommittees shall have full authority to hear and determine licensing applications.

(5) The Committee and Subcommittees shall be further empowered to determine appeals made against the decisions of the Director of Neighbourhoods taken under delegated authority on licensing applications. (See Council delegation schedule for more details)

(6) The Committee shall at all times carry out its duties solely within the policy from time to time determined by the Council and shall conduct its proceedings in accordance with the requirements set out in Appendix 3 (Conduct of Business by Licensing Committee and Subcommittees).

(7) The Licensing Committee shall take no part in the production or revision of the statement of licensing policy made under Section 5 of the Licensing Act 2003, however, they may determine policy under the legislation listed in Appendix 2 to this Article.

(8) To be responsible for the consideration and approval of Designation Orders under Section 13 of the Criminal Justice and Police Act 2001 (Exercise of Controls over the consumption of alcohol in Public Places).

APPENDIX 3

PART A – CONDUCT OF BUSINESS BY LICENSING COMMITTEE AND SUBCOMMITTEES

All references to committee in this annex shall be taken to infer a reference to the associated subcommittees.

1. General Conduct

- 1.1 All hearings of the Licensing Committee under the Licensing Act 2003, are to be held in accordance with the Personal Licences, Hearings, Premises Licences and Club Premises Certificates, and Licensing Register Regulations, made under the Licensing Act 2003.
- 1.2 The Council's Constitution shall regulate the conduct of and debate at meetings.
- 1.3 In the case of hearings under the Licensing Act 2003, the Committee shall only consider those matters relevant to the licensing objectives as set out in the Licensing Act 2003 and the statement of licensing policy adopted by the Council.

2. Declarations of Interest

2.1 Members of the Committee are subject to the Council's Code of Conduct.

3. Participation in the Hearing

- 3.1 Debate shall be restricted to members of the Licensing Committee. Where a local ward member, not being a member of the Committee, wishes to participate in the hearing, they may do so only with the permission of the Chairman and their participation shall be subject to the same rules as are applied to any other witnesses to the application.
- 3.2 In hearings other than those under the Licensing Act 2003, where a ward member is a member of the Committee, and wishes to object to the application, the member shall give 14 days' notice of their intention, and shall play no part in the decision-making process of the Committee. In hearings under the Licensing Act 2003, those named as responsible authorities and interested parties in the Act may only make representations within the time limits set out in the relevant statutory provisions.
- 3.3 All persons participating in the hearing shall be made aware of the limitations or scope of statements that will be acceptable and, in particular, that statements should be factual or a fair statement on a matter of public interest.
- 3.4 In the case of any hearing pursuant to the summary review procedure under the Violent Crime Reduction Act 2006, the membership of any Subcommittee adjudicating on such a review shall comprise any three members drawn from the Licensing Committee subject to the proviso that no member should serve more than one hearing.

4. Attendance of the Public

4.1 The Council's Constitution and relevant statutory provisions relating to the admission or exclusion of the public shall apply to all meetings of the Licensing Committee.

5. Natural Justice

5.1 There are two elements to natural justice:

(a) Fairness

- (i) All persons affected by the decision or in the case of matters associated with the Licensing Act 2003, those named as responsible authorities and interested parties in the Act, will be allowed a hearing before a decision is made.
- (ii) Only objectors who can show clearly that they are affected by a decision shall be afforded the right to be heard or, in the case of hearings under the Licensing Act 2003, only those named in the Act as responsible authorities or interested parties.
- (iii) All information shall be made available, where possible in advance, to the applicant and the Committee.
- (iv) All members of the Committee shall be present throughout the hearing of a particular application. Where a member arrives late or leaves during a hearing of a particular application, that member shall play no part in the decision-making process. Where an application is adjourned it shall be continued by the same members only, and no others.
- (v) The Committee shall have discretion in respect of 'late' objections. Such objections shall be clearly marked on the agenda as such and the Committee shall decide on their acceptability. The applicant shall be advised of any late objections. In the case of representations made in relation to the Licensing Act 2003 applications, these shall only be accepted in accordance with the relevant statutory provisions.

(b) Prevention of Bias

- (i) The rules on the declarations of interest shall be firmly applied.
- (ii) If the Committee moves into private session to consider its decision, it shall be accompanied only by its advising officers, none of whom shall have taken a substantive part in the hearing, and shall play no substantive part in the decisionmaking process.

6. General Procedures for Hearings

- 6.1 The following procedural requirements shall be followed at all times:
 - (a) There shall be no recommendation from officers on the agenda;
 - (b) The Committee shall be supplied with copies of all relevant documentation and the process and order of procedure shall be as follows:

- (i) The Chairman will open the meeting and introduce persons as appropriate asking applicants and representatives to identify themselves.
- (ii) The Chairman will outline the procedure to be followed.
- (iii) The Lead Officer will outline the matter in hand.
- (iv) The applicant or representative will present his/her case, with or without witnesses, and be questioned by members or any objectors/persons making representations present.
- (v) Any objectors/persons making representations may then present their objections/representation, with or without witnesses, and be questioned by members or the applicant/s or their representative.
- (vi) The objectors/persons making representations may make a final statement (without introducing new issues).
- (vii) Finally, the applicant has the right to make a final statement (without introducing new issues).
- (viii) All evidence/disclosures are to be made in the presence of all persons, unless someone voluntarily excuses themselves from the proceedings.
- (ix) Committee members shall restrict themselves to questions and not discussion or comment.
- (x) The applicant, objectors/persons making representations shall be allowed to ask officers questions of a technical/factual nature at any time during the proceedings.
- (xi) An adjournment should be granted where to do otherwise would deny a fair hearing.
- (xii) The Committee may resolve to decide upon the application in private session, however, if it becomes necessary to recall anyone for additional information, everyone shall be invited to return to the Hearing.
- (xiii) The decision shall be given in the presence of all parties that wish to be present and confirmed in writing as soon as possible thereafter. If legal advice is given to members this advice will be repeated in summary form.

Decision Required:

To determine an application for an Expedited Summary Review of the Premises Licence and to consider relevant representations as a result of the review application.

Report:

1. An application for an Expedited Summary Review of a Premises Licence under Section 53A of the Licensing Act 2003 was received from Essex Police in respect of a Premises Licence issued to Luxe Essex, Loughton Essex IG10 4BE.

2. On 5th May 2017 in accordance with Section 53B of the Licensing Act 2003, the Licensing Authority after reading Essex Police's review application made the decision to implement the following interim step to take effect immediately:

(a) To suspend the Premises Licence until the Review hearing.as there was a danger of further serious crime and serious disorder.

3. A copy of the application for a summary review and the certificate under Section 53A(1)(b) was served on the holder of the Premises Licence and all responsible authorities. The certificate stated that in the opinion of Superintendent A Mariner, the Premises were associated with both serious crime and disorder.

4. The application was advertised in accordance with Section 53(A)(3)(c) of the Licensing Act 2003 and Regulation 38 of the Licensing Act 2003 (Premises Licences and Club Premises Certificates) Regulations 2005, thereby inviting representations to be made by responsible authorities and interested parties. Any representations had to be received by the Licensing Authority by 17 May 2017.

5. A copy of the application for review is attached at Appendix A. Also attached at Appendix B is a location map showing the premises and surrounding area.

6. On 5th May 2017 Premises Licence Holder submitted a statement to the panel members, which was considered when they made the first interim steps, however members felt that the decision to suspend the licence should remain in force until the full hearing on the 30th May 2017.

Current Premises Licence

7. A copy of the current Premises Licence which includes conditions is attached at Appendix C.

Grounds for Review

8. In support of the application Essex Police have supplied a list of incidents, and these are attached with the application at Appendix A.

Relevant Representations

9. The Licensing Authority has received a representations from Loughton Town Council, the responsible authority for Planning matters and numerous objections from Loughton residents relating to the licensing objectives.

There is one email in support of the premises.

10. The Premises Licence Holder, the applicant for the review and all interested parties have been invited to attend this hearing and will be given the opportunity to address Members.

Legal Considerations

11. Members are asked to make their decision based on consideration of the representations received with a view to promoting the four licensing objectives which are:

- Prevention of crime and disorder.
- Public safety.
- Prevention of public nuisance.
- Protection of children from harm.

Options

12. In the case of a review of a Premises Licence the Licensing Sub-Committee has the following options:

- (a) To modify the Conditions of the Premises Licence and/or attach new conditions;
- (b) To exclude from the Licence a licensable activity;
- (c) To remove the Designated Premises Supervisor;
- (d) To suspend the Licence for a period not exceeding 3 months;
- (e) To revoke the Licence;
- (f) To leave the Licence in its existing state.

At 02.50 a.m. on the morning of Sunday 30th April 2017 emergency services were called to outside the Luxe Essex nightclub with 999 callers reporting around 30 people fighting and a male having been stabbed in the chest and arm with an initial report stating the suspect was inside the club.

Further calls were received that nearby in High Beech Road a group of males, one holding a broken bottle and covered in blood, had gained entry to a communal flat area and appeared to be hiding. Shortly afterwards another group of males arrived looking for the first group. This second group, at least one armed with a belt, surrounded and terrorised a lone female occupant of the Beech Road flats who had fled to safety and demanded to know where the other group was.

Initial police inquiries conclude those involved in this stabbing and disorder had only recently left the Luxe Essex nightclub with one eyewitness stating the stabbing took place when the victim left the premises and got into an argument with a group of males, one of whom pulled out a black pen knife and stabbed the victim.

During the disturbance a named female was also knocked unconcious and other named victims assaulted.

It is believed one of the second group of males (above) was significantly injured as he was seen being carried/assisted into a vehicle that left the scene shortly after.

Another male (yet to be traced) was stabbed to his hand and with friends left in a taxi, disclosing the injury to the taxi driver and being seen to be bleeding.

A knife and broken bottle have been located at the scene.

At this stage a number of witnesses (some of which were residents awoken by the commotion and screams) reported seeing fighting and general disturbances taking place in the areas and roads in the immediate vicinity of Luxe Essex.

A witness has told police that the fight started inside Luxe Essex, was stopped by door staff but then restarted outside with bottles being thrown.

In connection with the incident, a group trying to escape and hide have damaged a resident's summer house while climbing over it and damage appears to have been caused to the window of a nearby shop.

Police inquiries into the events continue and this includes securing further witness testimony and viewing CCTV images. However, initial viewing of the CCTV shows the primary stab victim and his attacker having an argument immediately outside the club before the victim is stabbed.

This victim's injuries were at first considered life threatening (with a puncture wound to the chest being millimetres away from the heart) but he has since been stabilised having had surgery on the 2nd May.

This is the latest, and most serious incident of disorder and crime occuring in or in the immediate vicinity of Luxe occuring chiefly between 0100 and 0300 when other (alcohol) licensed premises in the vicinity are shut.

Other reported incidents which, taken with the most recent incident, evidence an association with both serious crime and serious disorder include (but are not limited to) the below reports:

02:49 a.m. 23rd April - persons fighting outside; 02:31 a.m. 15th April - 10 persons fighting outside;

02:41 a.m. 18th March - Altercation outside between persons and where a person was subsequently hit by a car when they run into the road; 02:47 a.m. 4th March - staff reported a private party had got out of hand and

around 25 people were outside causing a disturbance:

02:44 a.m. 25th April - a Street Pastor reported a large number of persons had left Luxe and were fighting, with people in the roadway;

01:38 5th February - large fight in the terrace area of the club with bottles being used; and

01:15 a.m. 4th February where a male reported he had been threatened, on the dance-floor, with a knife.

Essex Police have taken this unusual step of applying for a 'Summary Review' because officers believe there has, in recent weeks, been a significant escalation in the number and types of incidents taking place in connection with this venue, in part occassioned by a change in its customer base and an appeal to persons from outside the Epping Forest district. Police meetings with the proprietors of Luxe have not resulted in any significant improvement.

If the venue remains open under its existing management structure, operates its existing working practices and procedures, attracts the same customer base and continues to remain open after midnight (which is its prime attaction in this locality) Essex Police are concerned this escalation in violence and disorder will result in a fatality.

At the full Licensing Sub-Committee hearing Essex Police will be making submissions to the Authority that the licensing objectives would be best met if the existing premises licence is revoked.

Ahead of a full licensing hearing, Essex Police would invite the Licensing Authority to consider whether Luxe should be permitted continue to sell alcohol or provide regulated entertainment.

Notes for guidance:

1. A certificate of the kind mentioned in the form must accompany the application in order for it to be valid under the terms of the Licensing Act 2003. The certificate must explicitly state the senior officer's opinion that the premises in question are associated with serious crime, serious disorder or both.

Serious crime is defined by reference to section 81 of the Regulation of Investigatory Powers Act 2000. In summary, it means:

 conduct that amounts to one or more criminal offences for which a person who has attained the age of eighteen and has no previous convictions could reasonably be expected to be sentenced to imprisonment for a term of three years or more; or
 conduct that amounts to one or more criminal offences and involves the use of violence, results in substantial financial gain or is conduct by a large number of

persons in pursuit of a common purpose.

Serious disorder is not defined in legislation, and so bears its ordinary English meaning.



Annex 1 – Mandatory conditions:

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:
 - a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or when the designated supervisor has a licence suspended
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence (see section 19 Licensing Act 2003)
- 3 Where a condition applies requiring a person to carry out a security activity at the premises, those individuals must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority (see section 21 Licensing Act 2003)
- 4. Where a premises licence authorises the exhibition of films, the admission of children to the exhibition of any film is to be restricted in accordance with section 20 Licensing Act 2003.

Conditions 5, 7 & 9 do not apply to premises licences where it authorises only the sale by retail off the premises.

5.—(1) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

(2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children–

(a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage,

individuals to-

(i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the

premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or

supply alcohol), or

(ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);

(b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);

(c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;

(d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on--

(i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or

(ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;

(e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.

6. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).

7. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

8.—(1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

(2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.

9. The responsible person shall ensure that-

(a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—

(i) beer or cider: 1/2 pint;

- (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
- (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and

(b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

For the purposes of these conditions a responsible person is

- the holder of a premises licence in respect of the premises,
- the designated premises supervisor (if any) under such a licence, or
- (any individual aged 18 or over who is authorised for the purposes of this section by such a holder or supervisor,

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule:

Prevention of Crime and Disorder

1. CCTV covering the internal and external of the premises will be installed and maintained. It will be recording at all times the premises are open to the public and will be kept in an unedited format for a period not less than 31 days. The images are to be made available to Police, Local Authority or Trading Standards for inspection upon request.

2. Reasonable and adequate staff training to be carried out and properly documented in relation to:

- i) dealing with incidents and prevention of crime and disorder;
- ii) drug awareness;
- iii) sale of alcohol (to underage, persons over 18 purchasing for underage, drunks, etc.) prior to being allowed to sell alcohol.

3. All training records will be retained for 12 months and made available to police and local licensing officers upon reasonable request.

4. A minimum of 3 SIA door staff, or 2 door staff per 60 customers or part thereof, whichever is the greater, to be deployed from 21.00 hours.

5. All door staff will wear SIA registration badges and those engaged outside the premises will wear high visibility jackets or vests.

6. The DPS (or representative) will complete an incident log at the end of each trading day. They will be responsible for recording any incidents, and include the outcomes, as detailed below. Such a record shall be made available for inspection by the Licensing Authority and Police immediately upon request.

- i) all crimes reported to the venue
- ii) all ejection of patrons
- iii) any complaints received from members of the public or customers

- iv) the seizure of drugs or offensive weapons
- v) the full name and registration number of any SIA door staff, or other member of staff, who has been involved in dealing with any of the above matters (i-iv).

Such a log will be signed off by the DPS on a monthly basis, indicating the outcome of each incident.

7. A minimum of four out of ten persons entering or re-entering the premises will be subject to a search by a SIA trained staff member during the times they are on duty. Any person who refuses to be searched will be refused entry. All searches must be carried out in full view of a CCTV camera.

No person found with, or using a weapon or illegal drugs may enter or remain on the premises.

8. No sales shall be made to anyone to appears to be intoxicated.

9. Suitable and sufficient external lighting shall be installed to adequately light the façade and immediate footpath adjacent to the façade of the premises.

10. Radio pages on EMR frequency to be used by door supervisors.

11. No entry granted to persons who appear to be intoxicated.

12. The premises will participate in the local recognised pub watch or equivalent scheme.

13. The DPS shall contact the Police Licensing Officer every 4 months to review compliance with conditions and discuss any incidents that have been recorded.

14. No glassware or other drinks containers may be taken off the premises.

15. The smoking area is to be positioned at the rear of the premises and patrons are not to be allowed to smoke outside the front of the premises.

Public safety

16. The premises risk assessment document will stipulate the maximum number of patrons to be accommodated at any time.

Prevention of Public Nuisance

17. Notices shall be prominently displayed at all exits requesting patrons to leave quietly.

18. DPS and door staff to request patrons to leave in a quiet and orderly manner.

19. The retained SIA door staff will remain on duty outside the premises for 30 minutes after closing time and shall supervise exiting patrons behaviour in the area shown on the attached plan (marked LN/210002365). The patrolling supervisors shall be attired as in condition 5. The patrolling supervisors shall cooperate with the police and any other enforcement agencies during this time.

20. Deliveries and services are carried out between the hours of 08.00am and 19.00pm.

21. To prevent glass noise, waste bags containing bottles are to be stored in the garden and bins are to be filled between 09.00 am and 20.00pm.

22. No entry or re-entry after 01.00am on Thursday, Friday and Saturday or on any night the premises trades beyond 01.00am. Management will provide a secure system to identify those persons exercising the right of re-entry. i.e. coded wrist bands/vouchers etcetera.

23. An appropriate automatic sound control device must be installed and used for amplified music. The devices should be set so that the volume of any amplified sound emanating from the premises does not cause a public nuisance.

24. The premises licence holders shall inform nearby residents, by leaflet drop or other appropriate method of communication, as agreed with the Licensing Authority, and upon permanent public notices affixed to the main/side entrance doors of the premises, a dedicated mobile phone number for 24 hour contact with the management team for emergency and complaint purposes. (see condition 6 for the recording of any calls received.) The DPS or day to day managers to carry this phone with them when the premises are open and trading.

25. The DPS (or representative) shall monitor the volume of any music emanating from the premises and adjust the volume to ensure that any amplified sound or other music from the licensed premises shall not cause a public nuisance.

The protection of children from harm

26. The premises will operate a Challenge 25 policy. Only photographic forms of identification are acceptable. These are:

- i) Passport
- ii) Driving Licence
- iii) Accredited proof of age card bearing the 'PASS' hologram.

27. Children will be permitted upon the premises only when in the company of a responsible adult – or when attending a bona fide pre-arranged event.

28. Children generally will not be permitted to remain at the premises after 21.00 hours (except when attending a bona fide pre-arranged event).

1.0 BACKGROUND

This is an application for the review of the premises licence relating to Luxe Essex, 126 High Road, Loughton. The premises operate under a premises licence issued to Peach Entertainment Limited.

It is the police submission that serious crime and disorder, and public nuisance occur in, and in the vicinity of Luxe Essex when open, all predominantly after 0100 when it is the only premises open.


The premises in the immediate vicinity include:

- a) Hollybush, 140 High Road whose licensable activities cease at 0100 on Friday and Saturday.
- b) NU Bar, 153 High Road whose licensable activities cease at 2300 on Friday and Saturday since 7th March 2017. Prior to which the licence was suspended on 9th February 2017.

3.0 FURTHER EVIDENCE

- 3.1 This is the latest in a series of incidents of disorder and public nuisance in recent months.
- 3.2 **DOCUMENT 2** is a map showing the location of incidents within a 100 metre radius of Luxe Essex which are detailed in **DOCUMENT 3**.
- 3.3 DOCUMENT 3 is a list of the incidents shown plotted on DOCUMENT 2. It shows 21 incidents since 1st December 2016 that have occurred at or which Essex Police believe have a causal link to Luxe Essex. A further 4 incidents since 1st February 2017 have occurred in the vicinity during the times at which Luxe Essex is open. CCTV in relation to incidents 4, 12, 13, 17, 23 has been provided and shows persons congregating at the front of the premises when closing, and fights breaking out. This is a regular nuisance to the residents nearby.
- 3.4 **DOCUMENT 4** are newspaper reports related to incidents or complaints regarding Luxe Essex. One of which details how residents have raised a petition calling for action to be taken.
- 3.5 **DOCUMENT 5** details meetings had with the Luxe Essex management since February 2016. Navin IYAPAH is the majority shareholder of Peach Entertainment Limited; and as such meetings were with him as a representative of the Premises Licence Holder. These meetings were to address incidents pertaining to and the management of Luxe Essex.

4.0 SUMMARY

4.1 Essex Police believe that the siting of a late night establishment in a densely residential area such as the High Road is always likely to undermine the licensing objective of preventing a public nuisance unless sufficient and adequate dispersal measures are in place. The presence of Luxe Essex and, until recently, NU Bar has demonstrated that this belief is correct with both premises having attracted the concern of local residents for many years regarding general noise and anti-social behaviour.

Luxe Essex has attracted its clientele from a wide area including North East London and this appears to have contributed to the significant nuisance and disorder occurring during dispersal after the end of licensed activity with groups of people, sometimes involving rival factions, gathering outside the premises while they wait for friends/family to collect them or

queue for taxies or await private hire vehicles. This attraction will continue whilst Luxe Essex continues to be a late night venue.

In particular, Essex Police has seen significant crime and disorder taking place between 01.00 hours and 03.00 hours with a strong correlation between the closing time of Luxe Essex and incidents of violence. Since February 2017 when NU Bar closed, a clear association between patrons and Luxe Essex, in the police submission exists – it being the only alcohol licensed premises open after 01.00 hours.

In the wider context, incidents of disorder and their severity have (in connection with Luxe Essex) escalated despite continual and regular conversation between the licence holders and police. These conversations have yielded little in substance and in particular there have instead been vague promises to increase vigilance and install some manner of identification system which has not materialised. Indeed the majority shareholder, as long ago as February 2016, appears to maintain a belief that police resources should be routinely deployed to the outside of his premises to ensure a safe and peaceful dispersal of patrons he has sold alcohol to – rather than accepting responsibility for the situation arising from how and when his premises trades. This is despite the licence holder being aware that violent incidents and lack of management action, led to nearby NU Bar having its licence first suspended and then heavily curtailed.

Essex Police considers that the owners and managers of the premises have little real interest in taking the necessary steps to change its client base, method of operations, policies, equipment and to exercise due diligence to meet the licensing objectives of:

- a) preventing crime and disorder;
- b) preventing public nuisance; and
- c) protecting the public from harm,

and thus the premises should no longer be permitted to remain open to sell alcohol and provide regulated entertainment.





Loughton Residents' Association fighting night club status for Luxe, in High Road

Households close to a bar notorious for noise and violence are opposing a bid by the owners for it to be officially recognised as a nightclub.

In September 2014, Luxe in Loughton High Road was refused permission to operate as a nightclub despite already promoting itself as one.

Luxe have now appealed the decision.

If unsuccessful, Luxe could be subject to restrictions on dancing and its entry policy.

Failure to comply would be a criminal offence, with the possibility of legal action by Epping Forest District Council.

David Linnell, of the Loughton Residents' Association, claimed many people "are fed up to the teeth" with noise, fighting, and drug use associated with the club, in High Road.

He said: "Our view is that Loughton High Road is a residential area.

"We would like to see it return to a pub and during the day we would like to see it open.

"At the moment it is a dead area in the middle of the area.

"The key thing is anything after midnight is bound to be disturbing residents when it closes."

Luxe, which opens until 3am at weekends, has been linked to a number of serious incidents including a 150-person brawl in 2011, a suspected homophobic attack in 2012 and a man's face being fractured so badly he could not talk to police.

Stephanie Moody, 55, of Smart's Lane, said she had phoned the police because of fighting as recently as Saturday (March 21).

She said: "Obviously it is worse in the summer, but it is a nightmare.

"Howling, bibbing their horns at the bottom, screaming up and down the road on their phones.

"We are actually seriously considering moving because of it, every weekend, Friday and Saturday.

"It is disturbing us.

"I have gotten to the point now where every time I am going to ring the police."

When contacted about the ongoing appeal process, a manager at Luxe, who refused to give his name, said: "We are not a night club and we never had a night club, we are a late night bar and our license states we are a late night bar."

Call for action after latest serious incident at LuXe in Loughton

A serious assault at a night club in Loughton has prompted people to again call for action by the authorities.

Neighbours of LuXe club in the High Road have spoken of their concern for patrons, as well as members of the community, after waking up to find blood-splattered pavements over the weekend.

Police have appealed for witnesses and information after two men were left with serious head injuries on Saturday morning (May 23) after a fight at LuXe nightclub in High Road, Loughton.

Another man received minor injuries in a separate incident in High Road on Saturday morning.

It is the latest in a series of serious incidents at the club, which has seen a 150-person brawl in 2011, a suspected homophobic attack in 2012 and a man's face being fractured so badly he could not talk to police.

Members of the public were woken by the incident on Saturday morning, which saw a large section of the High Road closed until 9.20am.

"There was blood outside on the pavement", said Roz Jones, 45, of Smart's Lane.

"It has either got to be shut down or something is going to happen - someone will get killed.

"Every weekend we get woken up by the screaming from the girls.

"I am all up for having a good time, but that just goes beyond.

"It is not right."

LuXe is currently trying to be officially recognised as a nightclub after Epping Forest District Council refused it permission in September 2014.

If unsuccessful, the club could be subject to restrictions on dancing and its entry policy, and could face legal action if it fails to comply.

The Loughton Residents' Association (LRA) has consistently opposed LuXe and other venues' attempts to stay open late at night.

David Linnell of the LRA said: "It is really down to the police - if they think things are not right they need to get an objection in.

A 28-year-old from Benfleet and a 29-year-old from Stanford-le-Hope were taken to hospital after police attended the scene shortly after 1.45am.



LuXe in Loughton banned from staying open as night club

A venue notorious for noise and violence has lost its battle to stay open as a night club.

Managers will be forced to remove DJ equipment and ban dancing in parts of LuXe in Loughton High Road, after a failed appeal against a decision by Epping Forest District Council.

The venue, which has been linked to incidents including a man's face being fractured so badly he could not talk to police, a 150-person brawl in 2011 and a suspected homophobic attack in 2012, will have to stop opening as a night club by the end of November.

Not doing so would be a criminal offence and could prompt legal action by the district council.

Stephanie Moody, aged 55, of nearby Smart's Lane, had opposed the club's appeal after frequently contacting the police about violence and drug use outside.

She said: "The decision is about time, it is really the best outcome.

"It will make such a huge difference to the area, early on Saturday morning you have to jump over the contents of people's stomachs.

"I am just really pleased it will stop as a night club so at two or three o'clock, we will not be woken up by police."

Campaign group and political party the Loughton Residents' Association (LRA) has previously called for the property to reopen as a pub.

However, Mrs Moody said she disagreed.

"There are so many in a couple of hundred yards, and you cannot have another restaurant or takeaway.

"I am sure they will find something."

David Linnell of the LRA said the group was delighted with the inspector's "common sense" judgement.

He said: "We are hoping this will mean residents will have a more peaceful time in future.

"If it was a proper pub, open during the day so it is not a blank space on the High Street and closing at a sensible time, that would be nice.

"We do not want to put anyone out of business, we just want them to operate in a way that is suitable for the area."

As well as removing equipment and banning dancing in places, Alan Woolnough of the Planning Inspectorate recommended LuXe stops charging for entry, closes a 'VIP Room' and starts opening during the day.

A decision on what to limits to impose will be made by the council.

Managers at LuXe have been contacted for comment.

Loughton neighbour fed up of violence in Smarts Lane

A NEIGHBOUR has complained of the violence outside bars near his house at the weekends.

Darren Stetzl, of Smarts Lane, Loughton, says he regularly gets woken overnight by fighting in his street.

On three occasions, February 25, 26 and March 4, Darren has called the police, but the problem persists.

Each incident has taken place near LuXe bar, the former nightclub at the end of Darren's road, and he has taken videos showing the incidents.

The commodity broker, 34, said: "It's awful. It's obviously really frustrating.

"The fact that we are expected to just put up with people fighting outside our house is just not acceptable. Our home is somewhere we should be able to go back to and feel safe."

Aside from the fighting, Darren has also seen people urinating on his property and his neighbours' cars.

He said: "About midnight, I heard my neighbour shout at a man urinating on his driveway.

"Across the road another man was urinating on the wall."

Darren has also seen other incidents. He added: "I was woken by screams of 'acid, acid, help, help'. I looked out the window and the car then ran a man over and broke his leg.

"It's carnage.

"You're fearful of leaving the house."

The trouble comes just two years after the venue lost its battle to stay open as a nightclub. It is now classed as a bar.

Darren added: "There's no reason why a bar should be open until 3am in the first place. Why does he (the manager) not like other clubs, knowing all the violence before, let them all back into the club. They must know the people who are causing the trouble."

David Linnell, of the Loughton Residents Association, said: "It's only recently that police have taken effective action.

"Our view is that the whole of that area is a residential area. Midnight is the latest time that anywhere should be open.

"There's a difference between what happens in the nightclub and what happens outside it.

"We would like to see the freeholder have another go and make it flats. That would sort out the nightclub and give everybody a good night's sleep. We would support that as an association."

The Guardian Series has contacted LuXe bar for a comment.

Essex police have confirmed that they were called to an incident in High Road, Loughton, at 2:45am on Saturday.

An initial hearing will take place by Friday May 5th. This may lead to the Council varying or suspending the licence, pending a full hearing within 28 days (we don't yet know the date of the full hearing but when we do we'll publicise it on our website and elsewhere).

For the Council to take action at the full hearing, they will need evidence from individual residents about the problems caused by LuXe.

If you have views on LuXe's licence, you should give them to the Council by May 17th – please email <u>licensing@eppingforestdc.gov.uk</u> or write to the Licensing Office, Epping Forest District Council, Civic Offices, High Street, Epping, CM16 4BZ. I am strongly against granting a licence to continue for the above property on the following grounds:

The prevention of crime and disorder.

There have been two occasions I am aware of when serious assaults have taken place soon after closing time of Luxe. We have had police knocking on the door for any information, roads and pavements barriered off by the police. This is in a residential area. The police will have records of the first date, the second occasion was on 3rd May.

Prevention of public nuisance

I have quite often been woken up on Friday and Saturday night/ early morning with people shouting, running along the street, slamming car doors and beeping their car horns. I do not have the dates as it happens quite frequently. When I have called Epping Council noise pollution they have told me that I need to call when it is happening, not the next day. I haven't done this as I don't want to wake the rest of the household up in the middle of the night.

Whenever I have friends to stay at the weekend I have to warn them that it can be noisy at night. We moved to Loughton as it WAS a lovely place to live.

I attended a meeting at Epping Council offices last year regarding Luxe and their status as a night club/ bar. It was decided by the council that Luxe should not have loud music or music system. However, I understand that they still have a DJ, a dance floor and loud music. How is that allowed?

Public safety

I have 2 daughters in their 20's who sometimes go to London and return late at night at the weekend as the trains run all night now. I am so pleased that they weren't returning home at 3.15 on May 3rd as they could have been embroiled in the trouble on that night. If the licence is granted, it is quite possible that trouble will happen again.

I do not think that Loughton High Road is a suitable place for a night club/bar with a very late alcohol license as it is a residential area.



You have been given yet another opportunity to do something about this place.

I cannot stand anymore violence outside my home spilling out from Luxe any longer. I have seen girls running away from groups of men, men being beaten up on the street, people covered in blood, someone run over, chemical substances thrown in peoples face, a stabbing and more. It has gort to the stage that if I heard a gunshot I wouldn't flinch.

It is scary coming home at this time with the violence going on. The thing I also find frightening is often the attackers make their escape in a getaway car, suggesting they arent even under the influence of alcohol and doing these acts sobre. Can you imagine a local resident getting caught up in this walking home from the night tube. Death or injury to a neighbour would be devestating.

The people who frequent the bar are not local people, but travel from London. Many are gang members. I know this because of the time I have spent speaking with police giving statements and reporting crimes. They cause chaos and leave, only to return the following weekend, only for the other gang to retaliate.

Whether these events happen on or off the premises it doesn't take a genius to put two and two together. There is no violence in the area when Luxe is closed. Luxe also does nothing to vet the people they are letting in. Please note how we are not complaining about any pubs in the area with later licenses. They are largely respectable to local residents.

I have had to call the police and ambulances so many times I have lost count having been woken up in the middle of the night after working a 60 hour week.

Please, please, please take some action. Even if you cant justify closing the place down, it should not be open past midnight. Turn it into a pub or restaurant. At least follow up on the action you took taking its nightclub status away. It is not a bar. Bars close at a reasonable time and don't have DJ events until 3am.



Sunday to Thursday Loughton is a lovely place to live. Your lack of action to date is killing the surrounding area.

Please consider the below my representation against the re-opening and issuing of a licence for Luxe nightclub.

I have categorised some examples of the incidents I have witnessed on a Friday and Saturday night over the past year between the hours of 2-3 am, when customers spill out of Luxe nightclub. I have not elaborated too much on each incident, as it is self-explanatory why such incidents are unacceptable.

We should not be expected to live with such regular violence and anti-social behaviour. When Luxe nightclub is closed during the week there is absolutely no trouble in the area. The nightclub is notorious and a danger to the public.

Neighbours have been complaining to you for years to do something and you have ignored us and our welfare. We maintained all along that it would take a death before you take any action having seen some horrific incidents in recent years. It seems a stabbing to the chest has been enough to grab your attention.

With over 300 local people signing a petition to close the nightclub, surely this demonstrates how strongly people feel, and what a negative impact Luxe nightclub is having on our lives. If the nightclub reopens this will be considered a complete sign of disrespect to local residents. You are not personally in the area at the time, so have no idea how bad it gets.

Please note how there is no campaign against any other late night establishments, which are largely respectful to the local community. The people who attend this club travel to Loughton from different parts of London and leave. They are not local people enjoying local nightlife.

See below some of the incidents I witnessed from my bedroom window in the past year alone, having been woken up at 2-3 am, specifically as Luxe nightclub closes:

The prevention of crime and disorder:

- A young girl left Luxe and was crying, being chased barefoot toward the forest by a group of men.
- A man was shouting and after a wheel spin was ran over, resulting in a broken leg.
- · Man was screaming "acid, acid, help, help!" after having chemical substance thrown in face.

- Man standing outside my driveway having been bottled. His face was covered in blood. I got him a glass of water.
- · Man unconscious in road after being beaten by a group of men with belts.
- Walked home from night tube through a 20 man brawl.
- Neighbour told me of woman screaming she had been raped in driveway. She had been date raped.
- Group of men standing around neighbours car and all urinating on it. I looked out window to ask what they were doing and they all waved and laughed.
- · Woman crouching in driveway urinating. She wiped herself after with a tissue from her bag.
- Fight outside house and men loitering, trying to hide. Scattered after police were called and started to arrive.
- Smoking marijuana outside my house, the stench was unbearable. I have also seen sniffing of
 cocaine as they think it is a quiet street and won't get seen.
- A man's head was rammed into cars during one fight and we woke up to expensive dents in our bonnets.

Public safety:

- When I walked home from the tube from a nice night out in the city I was petrified walking through the violence, police sirens and ambulances on more than one occasion.
- Being asked if I could see any weapons lying in street around my property was a scary thought. Police found a knife the next day.
- Drug wrappers. I constantly find discarded clear plastic bags with white powder residue and marijuana subs.
- Speeding cars flying out of the car park. I have seen sparks flying off the bottom of cars before going over bumps.
- Being fearful of looking out to say anything to gang members that are desecrating your property.

The prevention of public nuisance:

- Woken up by noise of cars revving engines in car park next to houses they seem to enjoy
 pretending they are in Fast and Furious movies at 3am.
- · Woken up by people in distress I think the above examples explain enough.
- · Woken up by girls screaming.
- Having to call police numerous times and spending my afternoons in the police station giving statements.
- · Being woken up by police sirens and lights almost every Friday and Saturday.

The protection of children from harm:

Speeding cars – someone will get run over one day.

- Weapons left in street I am fearful a child will pick up a discarded knife or weapon the following morning.
- Drug wrappers in street children often pick things up on the street and exposure to drugs would be devastating.
- Urinating on property and hygiene the smell is horrific, and I have seen children touch the walls that have been urinated on.
- Broken glass from drinks carried from Luxe and broken car windows regularly there are break-ins to cars and the glass is left in the street. Glasses are also used as weapons in fights.

I am writing to raise my concerns with the continued anti social behaviour which can be linked to the Luxe venue on Loughton High Road.

The establishment is in a residential area and does not cater for the needs of the local community. The venue appears to only be open on weekends, limiting its employment contribution to the local economy.

The venue is often empty until 10pm, when it is then populated by people attending from long distances away from the local area. Disturbance are regular after closing and the level of anti-social behaviour and violence is shocking. This ranges from urinating in front of homes to brawls, beatings and stabbings.

I live in Lower Park Road, Loughton and was woken at 5am on Sunday 30 April by the police helicopter. Walking along the High Road later that morning, with my Wife and nine month old daughter, I was confronted by a large police cordon and blood stains on the payment. We were on the High Road spending money in the shops and contributing to the local economy. It put us off and is likely to put others off from visiting the High Road.

Frequent Incidents like those from Luxe have a negative impact on local residents lives and the local economy, whilst not providing any benefit to the local community.

Please do not allow this venue to continue to operate, as the licensee has not been able to control the actions of the patrons, which is continuing to impact on local residents lives.

I understand that you are reviewing the license for LUXE, Loughton and I would ask that you take the following into consideration in doing so:

I lived in Loughton as a child and am now raising my family in Loughton. It has always been a vibrant town, with a variety of pubs and restaurants. This is what made it a lovely place to grow up and to raise a family. But it is a small town and I feel that night clubs, or pubs with very late opening hours, are not appropriate.

LUXE (and previously Nu Bar as well) have changed the atmosphere of the town entirely. It becomes a different town on Friday and Saturday night.

I no longer feel safe walking home after eating in the High Road restaurants or from the tube station, as I have to go past LUXE. In fact, it can also be quite intimidating even driving along the High Road on Friday and Saturday nights, due to the crowds of people that the venue attracts and their behaviour. The string of increasingly violent incidents is just not acceptable and quite frankly, terrifying for residents.

It simply isn't appropriate to have venues that attract several hundred people into a small residential town every weekend. Even if behaviour is well-controlled inside the venue, it is attracting vast numbers of people to the town that would not be there if it weren't for LUXE and the fact it's open so late. LUXE is keen to point out it has no control over what happens outside its venue but this is exactly why they shouldn't be allowed to open so late – they are bringing huge numbers of people to a small residential area but can't control them. They expect our police resource to do that for them.

And most of the customers aren't local residents and therefore we are not benefiting from LUXE's presence. This is evidenced by the recent incidents where all those involved – victims and perpetrators – have come from locations miles from Loughton. But we have to put up with the disturbance caused; pay to clean up the horrendous litter, broken glass and other debris that ends up along the High Road every Sunday morning; and paying to police the crowds that are brought into the area because of them

I would therefore urge you to use whatever powers you have to restrict the license of LUXE, to normal pub hours, for the good of the town's residents.

Ever since the opening of this Club the local residents have experienced nothing but trouble. However, the situation has now become unbearable and we, the residents, have had enough of being continuously ignored.

I live in one of the roads off the High Road and on Sunday morning at 2.30 am was again woken by a very serious incident arising from the above Bar. There were gangs of thugs fighting and weapons were used, resulting in many injuries. The Police were parked outside my house with their blue lights flashing all night long whilst they investigated the area for weapons. The noise was horrendous and we fell frightened and intimidated in our own homes. This is the "umpteenth" time we have had to tolerate such horror. Another time someone had a substance thrown in his face and we, along with our neighbours and their young children, had to witness his screams. On other occasions we have been woken up whilst leavers from the Club have literally been holding parties in our roads, fighting, leaving blood and debris all over the pavements, blatantly taking and dealing drugs in the car park and on the street, urinating and defecating in peoples' gardens, damaging property (cars), shouting and slamming car doors etc etc. The aftermath of all this can be seen the following morning, invariably with areas cordoned off by the Police. It is as though we are living in a "hell hole" instead of what was once a peaceful, safe and desirable place to live. Eventually, about a year ago, we were relieved to hear the Club was being shut down and the building turned into flats. Once again, the Club appealed and, unbelievably, were given ANOTHER chance !!.

I have previously been advised by EFDC that consideration needs to be given to the proprietor's livelihood. What about our livelihoods? My husband (not alone) works on a Sunday and constantly goes into work tired after a sleepless night. Why should their livelihoods be more important than ours?

It also shouldn't be difficult to realise that this place is a magnet for gangs and thugs to come in to Loughton from all areas.

Apart from all this, it must be costing an absolute fortune to police the area to this extent every weekend - all this coming out of our Council Tax budget!

Please can you finally do what should have been done from the very first incident - CLOSE THIS PLACE DOWN NOW AND GIVE THE RESIDENTS SOME LONG OVERDUE RESPECT !

To whom it may concern

I would like to make representations in regards to the licensing review of Luxe, high road loughton under the following grounds;

- The prevention of crime and disorder

The prevention of public nuisance

- Public safety

I am a resident of Smarts Lane IG10. Me and my husband have lived here only since January 2017 however it was quickly very clear the problems this venue causes.

Every Saturday and Sunday morning following the activities of the previous night there are without fail numerous discarded nitrous oxide (laughing gas) canisters on the pavement and road around the venue. Due to the quantity, this is clearly the remnants left behind by people dealing nitrous oxide balloons undoubtably to patrons of the venue. Supply of nitrous oxide in this form is a criminal offence (psychoactive substances act). Clearly the venue is attracting suppliers to it to ply their trade which given the remnants left behind must be highly profitable for them. It is well known that the people who supply nitrous oxide usually also supply other drugs i.e. Cocaine and cannabis. Or where there is a demand for nitrous oxide there is also a demand for other drugs.

All drugs including nitrous oxide have a risk to the user, but there is also the risk to others for example drug supply is strongly linked to anti social behaviour and violence. With the potential of serious violence between rival drug dealers or drug use causing users to become violent. Perhaps we saw one of these in action on 3/5/17.

As many people seem to drive to Luxe I am very concerned that customers are driving following the consumption of drugs. Driving following nitrous oxide consumption is an offence and causes danger to members of the public.

My route home from the train station is past Luxe and on returning home on a Friday or Saturday evening I often find it very intimidating. I often smell cannabis being smoked. On several occasions I've come across the venues patrons on Smarts lane itself having aggressive arguments or using the quiet alleys or drive ways to urinate or conduct what I suspect is Illegal activities.

As smarts Lane is very quiet from passing traffic and people I'm assuming patrons feel safe from being seen there.

Smarts lane is a quiet residential street with many young families and elderly people yet I am often woken up late at night on weekends by loud groups of people either arguing or just being generally antisocial. The venue seems out of sync with the rest of the local area and attracts activities which are unwelcome in a residential street. I particularly worry as I am currently pregnant and I don't want to bring up a child with these activities being common place

I have witnessed, stabbings, fights, acid attacks, baseball bat attacks, cars driving the wrong way up Smarts Lane at 50+mph, cars being driven into the front doors of Luxe to harm the bouncers, women crying on the kerb as they have had their drinks spiked, and also a man being run over with a car, then beaten to the point where 2 ambulances attended the scene!! Virtually every weekend I am woken at 2.30-3am by the fighting, noise, screaming!! We get no trouble whatsoever from The Hollybush that being because it closes at 11pm and everyone in the beer garden are made to go back inside at 11pm on the dot!! Quite simply, if Luxe was not there, we would have no trouble ... I dont understand how they can say the trouble is not their responsibility !! it happens exactly at closing time and is constant. I have absolutely had enough now. Its also bringing a terrible name to our beautiful town..... nobody in their right mind would come to a late night venue such as Luxe, for fear of getting caught up in the voilence afterwards,

For the reasons given below, the LRA Plans Group would support the removal of LuXe's licence.

Failing that, we would wish to see the premises closing no later than midnight, and with no TENs being granted later than midnight.

We submit that it has been clearly demonstrated by experience that a late-night bar (or a night-club) is not a suitable use for premises in this location.

All the roads leading to and from LuXe (except for the relatively short length of Old Station Road) are residential - there are flats over the High Road shops. There has been a long history of disturbance of residents over a wide area and of "minor" criminal damage to property. Recently there have been violent incidents in the street apparently relating to customers from LuXe.

We believe that it is clear that the current licence does not operate so as to prevent crime and disorder and gives rise to incidents which seriously threaten public safety.

We therefore urge the committee to take effective action.

As a responsible Authority under the 2003 Licensing Act this Planning Authority would support the revoking of the licence for this night club premises. The license review requested by the police has been brought about by serious incidents of crime and disorder. However the night club use, by reason of its late hours of opening, its attraction to customers from outside Loughton, and its position close to residential side streets, has consistently given rise to anti social behaviour and disturbance to residents living in nearby roads, for example High Beech Road and Smarts Lane, and this anti social behaviour and noise constitutes a public nulsance under the Licensing Act.

I would also add that planning permission was refused on 5/9/14 for the continued use of the premises as a night club – from its former use as a public house. A planning enforcement notice requiring cessation of the night club use has been served, and an appeal was lodged and subsequently dismissed. In planning terms therefore this night club use is an unlawful use, and legal action under the Planning Acts is proceeding to secure the termination of this night club.

Further to your letter dtd 3 may 17 I wish to comment as below. I live 100 yards away from luxe, I can see and hear it from my lounge, and I have suffered from its prescence here in loughton ever since the it opened.

1). High beech road (where I live) is the parking "lot" for luxe "clients". They park opposite my house at any time after 10 pm when its open. They sit in their cars and "preload" with alochol and dope before going to the "club". The smell of dope is sometimes so strong it permeates into my hallway. I have in the past approached these people whereupon I have on occasion, been verbally threatened with death!. The whole area around luxe is a no go area at anytime between 10pm and 3am. Anything can happen and sometimes does.

2). At anytime between 1 and 3.30am "clients" return to their cars shouting, yelling, swearing, slamming car doors, and driving away at high speed. I am always disturbed early on Sunday mornings by the above, police sirens etc etc.

3). In the warmer months there is constant noise from the luxe "terrace" open air area.

4). There have been several several violent stabbing incidents and brawls over the years. (one a few weeks ago.....where the police were in "residence" outside my house for several hours. No sleep for me that night!. In the morning there was still a police precence outside my house). I dread to think of the cost of the policing and ambulance services that evening to the tax payer.

5). On sundays I have found the detritous of club life deposited on the pavements and curbs nearby, glasses, gas bottles, condoms, ...even girls underwear!.

It is clear that this establishment should not operate in this location.(or for that matter ar all!)...It is a clear threat to public safety as well being a hot bed for the thriving drug trade (for which loughton is now sadly famous for ...would you believe as far away as scotland!) and is a clear public nuisance. It must not be allowed to operate any longer.

As a foot note, i' ve lived in loughton for many decades and I cannot think of any business, event, or other occurances that have bought loughton down to such a low level of depravity and genuinely affected the standard of living of so many residents in such a negative way for so many years.

The site used to be the home of the royal standard pub. Whilst not the best pub in the world (it did have a degree of notoriety!)... there were occasinal incidents, but they were nothing like we have seen since the arrival of luxe it closed at a sensible time, and did'nt require a police and ambulance prescence every Saturday!.

Hi, I am writing to express my grave concerns regarding this establishement.

I am a Loughton resident who lives at Smarts Lane, Loughton and have lived at this address for 22 years. I live directly behind Luxe and next to the car park in Smarts Lane.

My concerns regarding Luxe are muiltiple and sincere... to the point that I have set up a petition to raise awareness of the amount of residents that want it closed down for good!! And I, along with a close neighbour went out posting this letter with your contact details... from David Linnell of LRA through every door in Smarts Lane, Forest Road, and High Beech Road!! I am not only concerned for public safety, but I have 2 teenage boys, who could quite easily get caught up in any of the trouble from there, when they are coming home from friends etc.. they do not drink in there, they dont like the people that Luxe attracts.

Luxe needs to closed down for good once and for all. The amount of incidents that have occurred over the years (before it was Luxe also) are absolutely shocking. I am in total disbelief that this establishement has not already been shut down. Every incident has occurred at exactly the time that it closes, and it is beyond a doubt a direct result of the late night drinking and I have been told and have witnessed drug taking. I am regularly woken at 2.30-3am by the fighting, and have witnessed every single incident that has occurred... my car has also been damaged from a mass 10 men fight a few months back. A man had his head smashed into the wing of my car. Every single incident has involved people from outside of the area.... none of the trouble has involved locals. I have literally, personally witnessed stabbings, bottlings, constant fights, acid attacks, baseball bat attacks, cars driving the wrong way up Smarts Lane at 50+mph chasing others, cars being driven into the front doors of Luxe to harm the bouncers, women crying on the kerb as they have had their drinks spiked, and also a man being run over with a car, then beaten to the point where 2 ambulances attended the scene!! I can and will elaborate on every single incident if you require any further information. The police have been in taking statements on numerous occasions!!

At the last incident, at 3am on Sunday 30th April, we stood at our bedroom window & watched 30+ mostly black men (and a few women) gathering outside my house, screaming & shouting, then a dark car with a loud exhaust flew up smarts lane the wrong way with the lights out, chasing someone. The fighting was going on next to my car and my partners work van, the police took 20 minutes to arrive. The following morning at 6am my partner woke up to take our dog out, to see the whole area outside our house, police taped off, and police at either end of the scene!! We could not get into either vehicle, or use them to take our son to his football match.... so had to call a friend who had to come to me in two cars so as to take us all!! T

My house is also situated behind the rear of the Hollybush, yet we have never had any trouble from there, everyone out in the garden get ushered back inside at 11pm on he dot!! Quite simply, if Luxe was not there, encouraging late night drinking, we would have no trouble... I dont understand how they can say the trouble is not their responsibility!!! The owners of Luxe have blatantly and ignorantly avoided any responsibility yet every incident happens exactly at closing time and is constant. I have absolutely had enough now. Its also bringing a terrible name to our beautiful town..... nobody in their right mind would come to a late night venue such as Luxe, for fear of getting caught up in the violence afterwards. Their statement that they sent out proves to me their sheer audacity and arrogance that they believe they will open again.... I actually believe that the next incident, someone will die.... I dont know how its not already happened!!

Please please do not even consider giving this establishment back any sort of licence. I strongly believe that no amount of doormen will help.... even a police presence has not worked in the past! I understand that you are reviewing the license for LUXE, Loughton and I would ask that you take the following into consideration in doing so:

I lived in Loughton as a child and am now raising my family in Loughton. It has always been a vibrant town, with a variety of pubs and restaurants. This is what made it a lovely place to grow up and to raise a family. But it is a small town and I feel that night clubs, or pubs with very late opening hours, are not appropriate. There has been a significant increase in violent crime, criminal damage and public disorder as a direct consequence of LUXE's presence. The venue also causes nuisance to local residents on a regular basis.

LUXE (and previously Nu Bar as well) have changed the atmosphere of the town entirely. It becomes a different town on Friday and Saturday night.

I no longer feel safe walking home after eating in the High Road restaurants or from the tube station. In fact, it is intimidating even driving along the High Road on Friday and Saturday nights, due to the crowds of people that the venue attracts and their behaviour. The string of increasingly violent incidents is just not acceptable and quite frankly, terrifying for residents. I fear for my children and myelf getting caught up an incident.

It simply isn't appropriate to have venues that attract several hundred people into a small residential town every weekend. Even if behaviour is well-controlled inside the venue, it is attracting vast numbers of people to the town that would not be there if it weren't for LUXE and the fact it's open so late. LUXE will no doubt be keen to point out it has no control over what happens outside its venue but this is exactly why they shouldn't be allowed to open so late – they are bringing huge numbers of people to a small residential area but can't control them. They expect our police resource to do that for them.

And most of the customers aren't local residents and therefore we are not benefiting from LUXE's presence. This is evidenced by the recent incidents where all those involved – victims and perpetrators – have come from locations miles from Loughton. But we have to put up with the disturbance caused; pay to clean up the horrendous litter, broken glass and other debris that ends up along the High Road every Sunday morning; and paying to police the crowds that are brought into the area because of them

I would therefore urge you to use whatever powers you have to restrict the license of LUXE, to normal pub hours, for the good of the town's residents. Specifically to protect public safety, reduction of crime and disorder and public nuisance all illustrated above.

We are Steve and Ali Hale of the second of the second and we are e-mailing to comment on the licensing of LuXe Bar, High Road, Loughton. We consider that the bar's licence should be suspended since the bar contravenes the following licence objectives:

Prevention of crime and disorder:

We were woken in the early hours of one Sunday morning by blue flashing lights. When we looked out of the window there were police and an ambulance parked outside the house opposite, paramedics were treating someone at the top of our neighbour's steps who was injured. We later learned that the patient was the victim of knife crime (fortunately not fatal) as a result of activities at LuXe. While the bar may 'police' customers inside the bar, once they have left they don't seem to accept any responsibility for the 'fall out' in the local area, even if there is trouble brewing fuelled by alcohol and/or drugs.

This incident was on our doorstep and on a recent Sunday morning we were dismayed to see Police tape and the road closed due to another incident related to the bar.

Prevention of public nuisance:

Customers regularly park their cars in our road, particularly on the opposite side where parking restrictions don't apply in the evening. We have often been woken at 2am and 3am in the morning by loud voices, arguments, the slamming of car doors and the revving of engines.

Protection of children from harm:

As we have already said, although customers may visit for an evening intending to enjoy themselves, the situation can quickly become 'ugly' as a result of too much alcohol and/or drugs. We have two teenage children and you can imagine our concern about what they might witness when we come back from an evening in London on the tube.

Public safety:

It's not only our children who feel unsafe walking near LuXe but also my wife and myself are more nervous coming home late at night from the tube station at the weekend since we have to walk by that area in order to get home.



It is apparent, given the number of disturbances, knife attacks and stabbings between rival groups using the night-time licensing facilities at LuXe, that LuXe have no **meaningful control** of persons using the venue. The instances of knife crime and attacks clearly originate within the premises, which then continue out onto the public thorough fares.

It is inconceivable that this lack of control is not known to the persons using the premises.

Please find below our comments to be considered in the full hearing review of the Luxe licence requested by Essex Police.

Loughton Town Council fully supports the views of local residents and OBJECTS to the continuation of the late night licence for Luxe.

Despite its High Road location, the impact of the antisocial behaviour and activities associated with this club have, over a long period, had an unacceptable impact on our residents living in the surrounding roads. Residents will have submitted detailed accounts of the problems that they have experienced in recent years.

This situation is in contravention of the four licensing objectives

- The prevention of crime and disorder
- Public safety
- The prevention of public nuisance
- The protection of children from harm

Whilst the town council is keen to support local business and facilities, this type of venue is clearly not an asset for our own residents but attracts customers from further afield, a situation intensified by the all night underground services.

The Town Council previously objected to the granting of this extended opening hours licence in 2012, stating that the proposals would only serve to exacerbate noise late at night from patrons using the club. This has proved the case and the recent incident only reinforces the Council's view that the licence should be withdrawn.

I am the registered proprietor of 18A High Beech Road, Loughton IG10 4BL and have lived here for over 15 years.

I submit that the sub-committee should take immediate and urgent steps to remove the Licence held by Luxe Essex.

I have a direct view of Luxe Essex across the adjacent car park and have witnessed numerous disturbing instances of violent, anti-social and criminal behavior exhibited by patrons of Luxe Essex. I can verify that Luxe Essex patrons cause these offences as I can see where they have come from as they cross the car park and enter High Beech Road.

Amongst numerous disturbing and frightening events, I have seen open and blatant drug dealing and drug taking in the car park, fights including with knives and broken bottles, harassment and assaults including of women, drunken or drugged behavior, gangs of youths screaming obscenities, running and shouting and creating havoc and fear when local residents including myself have been trying to sleep, often between 2.30am and 3.30am in the morning, long after the nearby pub has closed. Many of my neighbours have young children and babies and I have been told they have been disturbed by these alarming events. I have also experienced two instances of damage being caused to my car parked legally on the driveway of my own property. I have been interviewed by the police on three occasions after such instances, usually enquiring if my CCTV covers the car park between Luxe Essex and my property. (It doesn't.) The police and ambulance service have been called to many of these instances of criminal behavior and I know that dangerous assaults including with knives, have been investigated.

Up until Luxe Essex began trading, going back to when it was The Royal Standard pub, there were no such instances of crime and violence that I was aware of. I and my friends and family felt totally secure walking around Loughton, even in the evenings, and did not live in fear of alarm and concern for my own safety or for the safety of my guests or my property. I now worry greatly, especially late at night at weekends, that there will be further violence and bloodshed, and it is greatly affecting my quality of life. In fact I have recently listed my property for sale, as I no longer feel safe living here.

I have never before lodged a complaint about any business, but given the seriousness of this situation I would urge you to do everything legally possible to put an end to this appalling nuisance which I know is also affecting many of my neighbours.
