Report:

Application

An application has been made by Mooros Chigwell Limited, Woolston Hall, Abridge Road, Chigwell, Essex IG7 6BX for a new premises licence at the same address.

The application is for the following licensing activities,

The Provision of Live Music (Indoors)
 The Provision of Recorded Music (Indoors)
 Late Night Refreshment (Indoors) and
 The Sale by Retail of Alcohol (for consumption on the premises)

2. The application was received on the 10th November 2020.

The Operating Schedule sets out conditions which will be attached to the licence if this application is granted.

The application was made as the previous premises licence for the location lapsed by virtue of the premises licence holder being a company which had dissolved.

3. When considering an application for a licence the licensing authority must have regard to steps that are appropriate to promote of the licensing objectives.

These are—

- (a) the prevention of crime and disorder;
- (b) public safety;
- (c) the prevention of public nuisance; and
- (d) the protection of children from harm.

4. It must also have regard to its Statement of Licensing Policy and any guidance issued by the Secretary of State.

Consultation

- **5.** The Responsible Authorities have all received a copy of the application, it was also advertised at the premises and in a local newspaper. A copy of the Blue Notice and Newspaper advert is attached to this report.
- **6.** All residences and businesses within 150 meters radius of the premises were individually consulted.
- **7.** The authority has received one (1) representation from a member of the public which is attached.
- **8.** There were also responses from Essex Police, Environmental Health, Essex Safeguarding, Community Resilience, Essex Fire and Rescue, Chigwell Parish Council and Planning, all of whom have no comments to make, please see letters and emails attached to the report.
- **9.** The Objection relates to Prevention of Public Nuisance and Prevention of Crime and Disorder.

Guidance Issued by the Secretary of State

- **10.** The Licensing Act 2003 provides that the licensing authority must 'have regard to' guidance issued by the Secretary of State under section 182.
- **11.** Sections 2.15 to 2.21 of the Guidance are relevant to this application

Options

In determining this application, the Sub-Committee may take any of the following steps as it considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives, namely:

- (a) to grant the licence as applied for subject to
 - the conditions mentioned in the Operating Schedule modified as the Subcommittee considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives, and
 - the mandatory conditions specified in the Licensing Act 2003, or
- (b) to exclude from the scope of the licence any licensable activities to which the application relates, or
- (c) refuse to specify a person as the premise's supervisor, or
- (d) reject the application.

Determination

The Sub-committee is asked to determine the application having regard to

- (a) the content of this report and representations
- (b) any additional information obtained from the hearing
- (c) the Council's statement of licensing policy
- (d) Guidance issued by the Secretary of State, and
- (e) the steps appropriate to promote the licensing objectives.

Appeal

If any party is aggrieved with the decision, they can appeal to Magistrates court. The appeal period is 21 days from notification of the decision.
